A cooperative is an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet common economic, social and cultural needs and aspirations through jointly-owned and democratically controlled enterprises. Cooperatives are based on the values of self-help, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity. Cooperative members believe in the ethical values of honesty, openness, social responsibility and caring for others. The seven cooperative principles guide the operation of all cooperatives:

- 1. voluntary and open membership
- 2. democratic member control
- 3. member economic participation
- 4. autonomy and independence
- 5. education, training and information
- 6. cooperation among cooperatives
- 7. concern for the community

Incorporation – can provide information and advice before you file a request to the Registrar of Cooperatives to incorporate your enterprise. While our advisors offer counselling assistance in the incorporation of new cooperatives, professional assistance from lawyers and accountants is strongly recommended.

Counselling Services – can provide basic information and advice to help emerging cooperatives make informed decisions about their projects, as well as links to other cooperatives and community economic development organizations.
