## **MANITOBA AGRI-FOOD EXPORTS, 1995 - 2004**

- Preliminary trade data for 2004 show a record value of major Manitoba agri-food exports to all destinations of \$3.405 billion, 9.8% more than 2003, and 13.6% more than the previous record of 2001.
- Ruminant exports were halted following the confirmation of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in a
  cow in Alberta on May 20, 2003. In September, 2003, a number of countries including the US and Mexico
  allowed a resumption of imports of specified Canadian boneless beef products. Live animal exports to the
  US were not resumed until July 2005.
- US import tariffs were imposed on Canadian wheat during 2003, beginning March 4 at 3.94%, and increasing by August 29 to 14.15% on Spring wheat and to 13.55% on Durum wheat. Durum tariffs were removed October 4, 2003, while Spring wheat tariffs were maintained. A NAFTA trade panel has ordered the US International Trade Commission (ITC) to reconsider the tariffs.
- The top Manitoba exports were wheat and flour totalling \$903.1 million, with hogs and pork totalling \$779.3 million, and canola, oil and meal totalling \$746.1million.

#### Unprocessed/Bulk:


- Unprocessed or bulk exports accounted for 51.8% of the 2004 total, up from 47.9% in 2003. Bulk exports were primarily field crops, and were valued at \$1.762 billion, 18.6% more than in 2003.
- The value of wheat exports (including Durum) in 2004 increased to \$899.3 million, 44.2% more than in 2003, while the quantity increased 46.9%. Exports in early 2004 were from the higher quality 2003 crop.
- The canola export value increased 9.3% to \$492.9 million, bolstered by a 10% increase in export volume.
- The total export values of barley and mustardseed were also higher in 2004 than in 2003.

#### Semi-Processed/Intermediate:

- Exports in semi-processed or intermediate form accounted for 26.3% of the total, and were primarily products from livestock, from oilseed and oat crushing, and pulse crops. Exports totaled \$894.6 million in 2004, close to the 2003 level, but more than 75% above 1994.
- Exports of live Manitoba cattle, bison, sheep, and goats were halted in May 2003, reducing the 2003 total and dropping the export values for all to zero for 2004.
- The value of Manitoba hog exports continued to increase in 2004, rising to \$352.4 million, 27.5% more than in 2003. The 2004 value was more than eight times the \$40.6 million of 1994.
- Increased global vegetable oil demand helped increase the value of Manitoba's canola oil exports to \$192.2 million, up 9.5% from 2003, but still well below the \$488.3 million of 1998.

### Processed/Consumer:

- Exports in processed form accounted for 22.0% of the total in 2004, slightly below the 23.3% of 2003. Processed exports totaled \$748.4 million in 2004, 3.6% more than 2003, and were primarily meat and potato products and honey. Since 1994, processed exports have increased more than 6-fold.
- The value of Manitoba's processed pork exports has dropped for 3 consecutive years. Pork exports totaled \$426.9 million in 2004, 2.7% below 2003 and 17.7% below 2001. Processed beef exports totaled only \$3.6 million, compared to \$6.9 million in 2000.
- Exports of frozen potato products increased to \$257.5 million in 2004, 25.1% more than in 2003.
