FARM INCOME FORECAST, 2005^P AND 2006^E

MANITOBA HIGHLIGHTS

Situation 2005:

- Manitoba farm cash receipts are estimated at \$3.69 billion in 2005, a 5.1% decrease from \$3.89 billion in 2004 as a result of problems in the crop sector.
- In 2005, crop cash receipts decreased by 27% to \$1.31 billion from almost \$1.78 billion in 2004. There were lower prices, lower marketings and lower returns for all major grains, oilseeds, and special crops.
- Livestock receipts were estimated at \$1.71 billion in 2005, an increase of 3.4% from \$1.65 billion in 2004. This slight increase was the result of a substantial improvements in cattle marketings which were 59% higher than in 2004.
- While overall livestock receipts increased, hog returns were down 11.2% from the previous year. Hog receipts were estimated at \$825.3 million in 2005. This decline in hog receipts is mainly attributable to lower prices since hog marketings were only down 1.1% (mainly in the export market).
- Direct payments to Manitoba producers totaled \$676.5 million in 2005, a 47.5% increase from \$458.7 million in 2004, due to increased payments from Crop Insurance, private hail insurance and the Canadian Agricultural Income Stabilization Program (CAIS).
- Farm operating expenses after rebates were \$3.1 billion in 2005, down 2.2% from 2004, mainly attributable to declines in share rent costs, livestock purchases and crop/hail insurance. This was offset by a 19.9% increase in machinery fuel costs. Most other costs remained relatively unchanged.
- Net cash income was estimated at \$619.5 million for 2005, down 17% from \$749 million in 2004. Realized net income after depreciation was \$223.7 million in 2005, down 37% from \$354.9 million in 2004. Due to a \$330.3 million draw down in inventories, total net farm income fell to \$-106.7 million, a serious decline from \$317.2 million 2004 and from \$435.2 million as the 2000-2004 average.

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Manitoba Outlook 2006:

- Farm cash receipts are projected to decrease by 7.1% to \$3.43 billion in 2006 primarily from continued problems in the crop sector.
- Receipts from crops may decrease a further 11% to \$1.16 billion primarily due to lower marketings of wheat, canola and most special crops. There were substantial crop quantity and quality losses resulting in record crop insurance payments.
- Livestock projections in 2006 are estimated at \$1.716 billion, up less than 1% from 2005 levels. Projected improvements in cattle marketings and prices are expected to translate into 16.9% increase in farm cash receipts. Hog marketings are expected to show a modest improvement, however weaker prices are expected to contribute to a 3.8% decline in receipts.
- The impact of the corn countervail is yet to be finalized. However, current estimates suggest that this could have a \$20 per hog impact for finished hogs in a farrow to finish operation. Cattle producers could expect a \$100 increase per head in the cost of finished cattle. The exact impact of the countervail is difficult to determine as substitution of other feed grains in rations could soften the economic impact. Increased exports of feeder pigs and feeder cattle could increase substantially which has the potential to impact cash receipts.
- In 2006, direct payments are estimated at \$557.8 million, down 7.6% from 2005 levels.
 Declines in Crop Insurance and other support payments are the major contributing factors.
- Further phasing-out of the Net Income Stabilization (NISA) program are expected to result in a 46.1% drop in payments for a total of \$35 million in 2006.
- In 2006, total operating expenses after rebates are expected to increase 5% in 2006.
 Rebates in 2006 are projected at \$19.9 million.
- Net Cash Income in 2006 is estimated to decrease 67.2%, projected at \$203.1 million, less than one-third of the 2005 level. After depreciation and inventory change allowances the Total Net Income is expected to be \$27.1 million, a long way from the \$435.2 million average in 2000-2004.


Definitions:

- Farm cash receipts measure the gross revenue of farm businesses and include revenues from the sales of crops and livestock products, program payments from government agencies and payments from private agricultural insurance programs.
- Farm operating expenses represent business costs incurred by farm businesses for goods and services used in the production of agricultural commodities.
- Net cash income represents the amount of cash generated by the farm business that is available for debt repayment, investment or withdrawal by the owner. It is a measure of gross farm revenue minus farm operating expenses.
- Realized net income includes net cash income minus depreciation plus income-in-kind. It
 represents the cash and non-cash financial flows that are attributable to the farm business
 and does not include changes in stocks.
- Total net income includes return to owner's equity, unpaid labour, management, risk and accounts for changes in the total value of inventories.


FARM INCOME AND EXPENSES 1971-2006
