Community Celebrates Griesbach Statue Unveiling

Edmonton, October 2, 2004 – Canada Lands Company today unveiled a magnificent statue of Mrs. Janet Griesbach in a formal ceremony at their Edmonton development, the Village at Griesbach. Over 300 guests, including Deputy Prime Minister Anne McLellan and Senator Tommy Banks, attended the ceremony to honour the wife of Major General Griesbach for her important contribution to the families of Edmonton during WWI and to celebrate Edmonton's centennial.

The statue unveiling ceremony was one part of the Griesbach Homecoming Weekend, which entailed a series of events at the former base, including a 50th celebration for the Major General Griesbach School.

The importance of military wives' support was a focus of the event. Barbara Booker, wife of Sergeant Booker with #1 Combat Engineer Regiment (1 CER), talked about her experience of keeping the home fires burning and the ongoing role of those who stay behind. "Our second child, Sarah, was born during the 2003 peace keeping mission in Kosovo," said Booker. "Knowing that my husband was serving our country abroad and making a difference in the lives of so many, made my family's sacrifice worthwhile."

"Major General Griesbach played an important role in Edmonton's history, and today we learned a little bit more about the woman who supported this remarkable man," said Doug Kester, Vice President, Real Estate, Canada Lands.
