Escarpment
































600 married quarters on site.

Top 3 Concerns

1. LAND

Potential Negative Impacts

- Damage to escarpment
- Loss of green space, trees, species
- Cookie-cutter development
- Sterile public places
- Traffic nightmares
- Neighbourhood character threatened

Seeking Solutions... #1

- Protect escarpment, trees, areas with environmental value
- Maximize natural greenspace, and link green areas
- Pedestrian / cyclist friendly

Seeking Solutions...#2

Diversity of housing and uses

- Community is accessible to physically challenged, mixed incomes...
- Public facilities built first

Seeking Solutions...#3

- Public spaces and services anchoring town centre
- Design to encourage use of public spaces
- Varied recreational / cultural opportunities on site

Seeking Solutions...#4

 Varied employment attracted to site (e.g. Science City)

Transit-centered design AND improved public transit

 Impacts on neighbourhoods determined with communities, and effects minimized
