CADET COMMANDS LAST PARADE

Comox - Eighteen year-old Cadet Chief Warrant Officer Dustin Bauch, Regimental Sergeant Major of 1726 Canadian Scottish (Princess Mary's) Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps, commanded his last parade on 31 January 2006.

“The past 5 years with 1726 Canadian Scottish (Princess Mary's) Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps has shaped who I have become today. ” Bauch stated. “The people that I have worked with and the group of cadets that I have had under my charge were the best and I would not trade my experiences with the program for anything.”

During his cadet career, CWO Bauch attend Army Cadet Basic in 2001, Cadet Leader Band in 2002, Cadet Leader Instructor – Drill and Ceremonial in 2003, and two years of Staff in 2004 and 2005. CWO Bauch had a distinguished cadet career where he received various cadet trophies and awards as well as the following prestigious medals; Lord Strathcona Medal in 2003, Royal Canadian Legion Medal of Excellence in 2004, and the 5 year Army Cadet Service Medal in 2005.

Royal Canadian Army cadets was founded July 25, 1879 by Militia General Order 18 that authorized the formation of Drill Associations for boys aged 14 and above. It was not until 1975 that girls were permitted to join the program. The aim of the cadet organization is to develop in youth the attributes of good citizenship, and leadership; promote physical fitness; and stimulate an interest in the activities of the Canadian Forces.
