Violence in the Workplace – Awareness **FREE!**

This course is offered free of charge by CCOHS to promote the awareness of this very important issue, and as a precursor to the other Workplace Violence e-courses: *Recognize the Risk and Take Action*, and *Establish a Prevention Program*.

Violence in the Workplace – Recognize the Risk and Take Action

Participants develop a clear understanding of what workplace violence is, the consequences of workplace violence, and what preventative measures can be taken.



Violence in the Workplace – Establish a Prevention Program

Introduces managers, supervisors and employees to the key components of how to develop an effective workplace violence prevention program.



Accident Investigation

Presents a practical approach to investigating workplace accidents by emphasizing how to find the root cause(s) – in an effort to prevent similar occurrences from ever happening again.



Electrical Hazards

Gives participants a basic overview of electrical hazards and safety issues commonly encountered in workplaces. Describes the basics of electricity, how to recognize electrical hazards and covers different types of preventative devices such as fuses and circuit breakers.



Health & Safety Committees

This course offers a practical introduction, providing guidance on how to establish a new committee, how a committee can perform its functions plus how it can be effective.



Health & Safety for Managers and Supervisors in the Canadian Federal Jurisdiction

Provides a practical overview of the health and safety responsibilities of managers and supervisors in Canadian federally-regulated organizations (CLC-II). Case studies and other examples are included to illustrate concepts. A useful starting point for managers and supervisors who will be taking further health and safety training.



Health & Safety Training for Managers and Supervisors

Developed by CCOHS, this comprehensive, popular course provides managers and supervisors and those with health and safety responsibilities with the information they need to prevent workplace injuries and illnesses and to develop a safety culture in the workplace.



Ladder Safety

Participants will learn how to work safely with ladders (step, extension and fixed ladders). Focuses on the duties of the employee when using a ladder – inspection before use, proper set up of a ladder, and how to work safely while on the ladder.



Office Ergonomics

Provides a practical introduction to Office Ergonomics, dealing specifically with problems and injuries related to the use of computers and other office equipment.



Office Health & Safety

Although offices are not always thought of as hazardous places to work, an injury or illness that happens in an office can be just as serious and costly as that which occurs in any other workplace. A practical introduction to office health and safety for managers, supervisors and employees, including health and safety committee members.



Personal Protective Equipment

Provides a practical introduction to the most common types of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) used to protect against common workplace hazards, such as chemicals, noise and mechanical injury.



Preventing Falls from Slips and Trips

Falls from slips and trips are common workplace injuries, which may cause serious injuries and disabilities. This course provides workers, managers and supervisors and committees with practical information, examples and tips to help them understand the causes of falls and to take preventative measures.



WHMIS for Managers & Supervisors

Helps managers and supervisors understand and meet their health and safety responsibilities under WHMIS, the system used across Canada to provide health and safety information about hazardous products in workplaces. Participants will learn about their WHMIS duties and responsibilities, WHMIS Symbols and their meanings, product labels, and material safety data sheets (MSDSs).



WHMIS for Workers

Familiarizes workers with the system used across Canada to provide safety information about hazardous products in their workplaces. Participants will learn about the WHMIS symbols and their meaning, the labels on products, and material safety data sheets (MSDSs).

Lockout

Provides a basic overview of Lockout, assisting the learner to recognize hazardous situations and to know when Lockout is required to control electrical or other energized hazards.

Confined Space: The Basics

Teaches participants how to recognize, understand and identify confined spaces and potential confined space hazards. Workers will learn how to assess and prepare to work in a confined space and how to use permits plus various control measures.

Confined Space Management

Benefits anyone with responsibility for establishing or managing a confined space program in the workplace. Designed for managers and supervisors of workers, or contractors who have control over access to confined spaces.
