## **British Columbia Artists and Arts Organizations Funded by the Canada Council, 2001-2002**

The single largest recipient of Canada Council funding in British Columbia in 2001-2002 was the **Vancouver Symphony**, which was awarded \$1,160,500 through the Council's Professional Orchestra and Residencies and Commissioning of Canadian Compositions Programs. The Vancouver Symphony is the largest arts organization west of Ontario and the third largest symphony in the country. The orchestra currently performs over 140 times a year, bringing concerts by composers such as **Mozart** and **Beethoven**, among others, to cities across the region. The orchestra runs several outreach programs, taking the symphony, musicians and composers out to schools for performances, and bringing students into open rehearsals at the orchestra's home, the Orpheum Theatre in Vancouver.

The Coquitlam performance group **Coyote Arts Percussive Performance Association** received a total of \$70,100 in grants from the Canada Council in 2001-2002, through several different programs. A portion of the funds, granted through the Aboriginal Peoples Collaborative Exchange – National Program, was used to support the development of **Quest**, a re-telling of an Aboriginal creation story in dance form. For this project, traditional Blackfoot dances were adapted into more modern styles of movement, recounting the narrative in an entirely new way. The principal creator of this fusion of styles, **Byron Chief-Moon**, writes that with works like **Quest**, “Boldly into the future we take our ancient North American dances, stories, myths and legends, a gift to our children.”<sup>1</sup>

In 2001-2002, the Canada Council awarded filmmaker **Virginia Baptiste** of Oliver, BC \$60,000 to produce a documentary focusing on the children of residential school survivors. Funds were presented through the Aboriginal Media Arts Program. Titled **I Hear the Cries: the Children of the Residential School Survivors**, the video uses interviews to explore how the experiences of residential school survivors affected their ability to act as parents. In giving the survivors' children a voice to describe their own experiences, Baptiste hopes to help break the cycle of abuse and addiction begun by the schools. A survivor herself, Baptiste notes that only through an examination and understanding of the past “can the healing begin and our children and grandchildren grow to know a brighter future.”<sup>2</sup>

Vancouver visual artist and art instructor **Shinsuke Minegishi** received a \$4,000 grant from the Canada Council in 2001-2002. Funds were awarded through the Creation/Production Grants to Professional Artists Program. A printmaker of the traditional Japanese style, Minegishi recently won the first Biennial International Miniature Print Exhibition for his work. The 2001-2002 funds were used to support research into a new method of printmaking using acrylic paints, rather than water-based, which represents a highly innovative development in the field. As a teacher at the Emily Carr Institute of Art and Design, Minegishi is also in a position to pass his knowledge on to students.

A grant of \$49,600 was awarded to **Sono Nis Press** in Victoria in 2001-2002 from the Canada Council, through the Book Publishing Support – Block Grants Program. Having recently celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Sono Nis Press is one of the oldest small publishers in Canada, and has the distinction of having printed some of the first works of authors such as **Susan Musgrave** and Governor General’s Literary Awards nominee **Marilyn Bowering**. In recent years, the press has branched out into other genres of writing, publishing books aimed at a juvenile audience such as **My Little Everest**. Sono Nis Press is committed to its region through its support of local writers and editors, and also through activities such as donating books to charities and sending authors on reading tours of the province.

**Ballet British Columbia** in Vancouver received a total of \$405,800 in grants from the Canada Council in 2001-2002. Funds were awarded through the Creation/Production Program in Dance, the Dance Touring Grants Program and The Dance Flying Squad Programs. Ballet British Columbia has a significant commitment to the creation, production and touring of original contemporary ballets, both the creations of its artistic director John Alleyne, and those of leading Canadian and international choreographers. The company strives for accessibility, premiering shows such as Alleyne’s **The Faerie Queen**, a ballet specifically designed for smaller venues in order to establish a connection between audience and performers. Through such innovative and highly successful productions, Ballet British Columbia “does not cater to a distinct or elite group [but] deals with universal thoughts and aspects of dance that gives it the ability to connect with many ages and tastes.”<sup>3</sup>

In 2001-2002, the **Vancouver Asian Heritage Month Society** received \$60,000 in support from the Canada Council. Funds were presented through the Equity Intersectional Capacity Building Program and the Inter-Arts Multidisciplinary Festivals Project Grants Program. Each year, the Vancouver Asian Heritage Month Society presents a month-long festival showcasing the artistic talent of Vancouver’s Canadian-Asian community. A wide range of events is featured, including historical walking tours, spoken word performances, literary readings, dance presentations and film screenings. The Society notes that one of the festival’s greatest contributions is “to foster cross-cultural understanding both with the various ethnic communities and with the mainstream.”<sup>4</sup>

Vancouver’s **Green Thumb Theatre for Young People** received a total of \$273,900 in grants in 2001-2002 from the Canada Council. Funds were awarded through several different Theatre and Outreach Programs. Green Thumb Theatre has also had the distinction of winning a Canada Council Theatre for Young Audiences Prize two years in a row, in 2001 for **Derwen is Different** and in 2002 for **One in a Million**. Formed in 1975, the company has grown to become one of Canada’s premier theatre companies for young audiences, touring school districts in British Columbia annually, as well as in the United States and internationally. The company has built its reputation on presenting plays that challenge young audiences rather than pandering to them, highlighting topics that range from immigration to alcoholism, from divorce to schoolyard bullying. The typical show presented by Green Thumb Theatre entertains but also “invites its audiences to re-examine their feelings, prejudices, beliefs and aspirations.”<sup>5</sup>

The Canada Council awarded Vancouver singer-songwriter **Veda Hille** (and her band) a total of \$46,900 in grants in 2001-2002. Funds were awarded through several different Music and Outreach Programs, including the Grants for Specialized Music Sound Recording Program, which supported the live recording of Hille's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary show. Hille is an independent artist who is always in demand for performances in Vancouver, but she and her band also tour regularly through the rest of Canada, the United States and the European Union. Hille is the creator of **Field Study**, an album based on her experiences during the **Yukon Journey Project**, a two-week wilderness expedition with eleven other artists in the Yukon funded through the Canada Council's 1999-2000 Millennium Arts Fund.

The **Haida Gwaii Singers** of Surrey, BC received a \$25,000 grant from the Canada Council in 2001-2002, through the Aboriginal Peoples Music Program. The Haida Gwaii Singers work to preserve the Haida Nation culture, largely by recovering and archiving traditional Haida music and songs. The 2001-2002 funds were used to research and document existing Haida songs into a complete collection, and to produce a song manual to meet the growing demand among younger members of the Nation for the material. This project not only helps preserve and record the Haida culture, but "leaves a legacy to future generations of Haida people as the clarity, strength and spirit of the old songs permeate the Haida Nation and carry the Haida culture forward into the next millennium."<sup>6</sup>

## Profil de l'aide accordée aux artistes et aux organismes artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique en 2001-2002

En recevant à lui seul, 1 160 500 \$, somme attribuée dans le cadre du Programme d'aide aux orchestres professionnels et du programme de Résidences et commandes de compositions canadiennes, le **Vancouver Symphony** est le plus important récipiendaire d'aide financière attribuée par le Conseil des Arts du Canada en Colombie Britannique, en 2001-2002. Le Vancouver Symphony est le plus grand organisme artistique à l'ouest de l'Ontario et le troisième orchestre symphonique en importance au pays. L'orchestre se produit plus de 140 fois par année, présentant dans des villes situées en région des concerts consacrés à des compositeurs tels **Mozart** et **Beethoven**. L'orchestre dirige de nombreux programmes de rayonnement, emmenant dans des écoles la symphonie, les musiciens et les compositeurs, afin qu'ils y présentent des spectacles, ainsi qu'en offrant aux écoliers d'assister à des répétitions ouvertes au public à l'Orpheum Théâtre, siège de l'orchestre, situé à Vancouver.

En 2001-2002, la **Coyote Arts Percussive Performance Association**, groupe de spectacle de Coquitlam, a reçu des subventions totalisant 70 100 \$, par l'entremise de plusieurs programmes d'aide du Conseil des Arts du Canada. Une partie de ces fonds, qui ont été attribués dans le cadre du programme Échanges coopératifs entre artistes des peuples autochtones – nationaux et internationaux, a été utilisée pour soutenir le développement de **Quest**, adaptation dansée d'une histoire de création autochtone. Dans ce projet, des danses traditionnelles pieds-noirs ont emprunté des styles de mouvements plus modernes, reprenant ainsi la narration d'une façon totalement différente. **Byron Chief-Moon**, principal créateur de cette fusion de styles, écrit que des œuvres telles que **Quest** “ transportent hardiment nos danses, histoires, légendes et mythes anciens nord-américains dans le future, véritable cadeau à nos enfants.”<sup>7</sup>

En 2001-2002, le Conseil des Arts a accordé à **Virginia Baptiste**, cinéaste d'Oliver, en Colombie-Britannique, la somme de 60 000 \$, par l'entremise du programme Subventions aux artistes autochtones des arts médiatiques, afin qu'elle produise un documentaire sur les enfants des personnes maltraitées en pensionnat. Intitulé **I Hear the Cries: the Children of the Residential School Survivors**, le video se sert d'interviews pour explorer comment le vécu des personnes maltraitées en pensionnat a affecté leurs réactions en tant que parents. En accordant la parole aux enfants des victimes, afin qu'ils décrivent leur propre vécu, Mme Baptiste espère rompre le cycle de l'abus et de la dépendance qui se crée dès l'école. Elle-même victime, Mme Baptiste souligne que seuls l'examen et la compréhension du passé peuvent “ amorcer la guérison et faire en sorte que nos enfants et petits-enfants grandissent en connaissant enfin un avenir meilleur.”<sup>8</sup>

**Shinsuke Minegishi**, enseignant en arts visuels et visualiste de Vancouver, s'est vu attribuer une subvention de 4000 \$ du Conseil des Arts en 2001-2002. Les fonds lui ont été accordés par le biais du programme Création/production aux artistes professionnels en arts visuels. Artiste de l'estampe de style traditionnel japonais, M. Minegishi a récemment remporté le concours de la première biennale internationale de gravure miniature. Les fonds octroyés en 2001-2002 ont servi à appuyer une recherche sur une nouvelle méthode d'impression

utilisant des peintures acryliques plutôt que de l'encre à base d'eau, évolution très novatrice dans le domaine. À titre d'enseignant à l'Emily Carr Institute of Art and Design, M. Minegishi transmet en outre son savoir à ses étudiants.

En 2001-2002, le Conseil des Arts a octroyé à la maison d'édition **Sono Nis Press**, à Victoria, une subvention de 49 600 \$ dans le cadre du programme Aide à l'édition de livre - Subventions globales. Ayant récemment célébré son trentième anniversaire, Sono Nis Press est l'un des plus anciens et petits éditeurs au Canada et se distingue pour avoir publié les premières œuvres d'auteurs telles **Susan Musgrave** et **Marilyn Bowering**, une des candidates sélectionnées aux Prix littéraires du Gouverneur général. Ces dernières années, la maison d'édition s'est orientée vers d'autres genres littéraires, publiant des livres destinés aux jeunes publics tel **My Little Everest**. Sono Nis Press se dévoue à sa région en appuyant les écrivains et éditeurs locaux, ainsi qu'en offrant des livres aux organismes de bienfaisance ou en organisant des rencontres littéraires avec des auteurs et ce, partout dans la province.

**Ballet British Columbia** à Vancouver a reçu du Conseil des Arts des subventions totalisant 405 000 \$, en 2001-2002, par l'entremise du programme Création/production en danse, du Programme d'aide à la tournée en danse et de la Brigade volante. Le Ballet British Columbia se consacre à la création, à la production et à la tournée de ballets originaux contemporains, qu'il s'agisse des créations de son directeur artistique John Alleyne ou de celles des chorégraphes canadiens et d'ailleurs parmi les plus renommés. La compagnie s'efforce de présenter des œuvres accessibles telles que **The Faerie Queen**, ballet spécifiquement conçu pour des petites salles, afin d'établir un lien entre les danseurs et le public. En présentant des productions aussi novatrices et extrêmement bien accueillies, la Ballet British Columbia " ne répond pas à la demande d'un groupe particulier ou de l'élite [mais] aborde des pensées universelles et des aspects de la danse qui lui permettent de joindre des gens de tous âges et de satisfaire tous les goûts."<sup>9</sup>

En 2001-2002, la **Vancouver Asian Heritage Month Society** a reçu 60 000 \$ en aide financière du Conseil des Arts. Les fonds lui ont été accordés dans le cadre du Programme interservices de l'accroissement de la capacité, du Bureau de l'équité, et du programme Subventions de projet aux festivals multidisciplinaires, du Bureau Inter-arts. Chaque année, la Vancouver Asian Heritage Month Society présente un festival d'un mois mettant en vedette le talent artistique de la collectivité canado-asiatique de Vancouver. Une vaste gamme d'activités sont présentées, dont des visites guidées historiques, des spectacles de littérature orale, des lectures publiques, des spectacles de danse et des visionnements cinématographiques. La Society souligne que, une des plus importantes contributions du festival consiste à " favoriser la compréhension interculturelle entre les diverses communautés ethniques et le grand public."<sup>10</sup>

En 2001-2002, le **Green Thumb Theatre for Young People** de Vancouver a reçu du Conseil des Arts des subventions totalisant 273 900 \$, par l'entremise de plusieurs programmes différents en théâtre et en promotion de la diffusion. Green Thumb Theatre se distingue aussi des autres compagnies pour avoir remporté un Prix de théâtre jeune public du Conseil deux années de suite, soit pour **Derwen is Different**, en 2001 et pour **One in a**

**Million**, en 2002. Créée en 1975, la compagnie est devenue l'une des premières compagnies de théâtre jeune publics au Canada, effectuant des tournées dans les districts scolaires de la Colombie-Britannique comme aux États-Unis et à l'échelle internationale. La compagnie a acquis sa renommée en présentant des pièces qui défient les jeunes publics plutôt que de se plier à leurs désirs, mettant en relief des sujets qui touchent à l'alcoolisme comme à l'immigration, au divorce comme à la brutalité en milieu scolaire. Le spectacle typique que présente le Green Thumb Theatre ne fait pas que divertir, il " invite les membres de l'auditoire à ré-examiner ses sentiments, préjugés, croyances et aspirations. "11

Le Conseil des Arts du Canada a octroyé à la chanssonnière et chanteuse de Vancouver, **Veda Hille**, et à son groupe des subventions totalisant 46 900 \$ en 2001-2002. Les fonds lui ont été accordés par l'entremise de plusieurs programmes différents en musique et en promotion de la diffusion, incluant une subvention du programme Enregistrement sonore de musique spécialisée qui a aidé à enregistrer le spectacle soulignant le 10<sup>e</sup> anniversaire de sa carrière. Bien que Mme Hille soit une artiste indépendante dont les spectacles sont constamment en demande à Vancouver, elle et son groupe effectuent régulièrement des tournées ailleurs au Canada, aux États-Unis et au sein de l'Union européenne. Veda Hille est la créatrice de **Field Study**, album basé sur les expériences qu'elle a vécues avec 11 autres artistes du Yukon, au cours du **Yukon Journey Project**, expédition de deux semaines en territoires sauvages financée par le Fonds du nouveau millénaire du Conseil des Arts en 1999-2000.

Les **Haida Gwaii Singers** de Surrey, en Colombie-Britannique ont reçu une subvention de 25 000 \$ du Conseil des Arts du Canada en 2001-2002, dans le cadre du Programme de musique des peuples autochtones. Les Haida Gwaii Singers travaillent à préserver la culture de la nation haida, principalement en retrouvant et en archivant la musique et les chants traditionnels haidas. Les fonds octroyés en 2001-2002 ont servi à effectuer des recherches au sujet de chants haidas existants, à les documenter et à les rassembler en une collection complète, ainsi qu'à produire un livre de chants, afin de répondre à la demande croissante exprimée par les jeunes membres de la nation à ce sujet. Le projet n'aide pas seulement à préserver la culture haida, mais " laisse un héritage aux générations futures du peuple haida, puisque la clarté, la force et l'esprit des anciennes chansons protègent la nation haida et transportent la culture haida dans le nouveau millénaire. "12

## Funding to British Columbia, 2001-2002

- In 2001-2002, the Canada Council for the Arts provided grants worth \$17.5 million to the arts in British Columbia.
- In addition to grants, \$1.2 million in payments was provided to 1,900 authors through the Public Lending Right Program in 2001-2002<sup>13</sup>.
- The Council awarded \$3.6 million in grants to 376 artists and almost \$14.0 million to approximately 309 British Columbia arts organizations.
- Grants were awarded to artists and arts organizations in British Columbia in all disciplines - dance, interdisciplinary arts, music, media arts, theatre, visual arts and writing and publishing. In 2001-2002, the largest amount of funding went to Music (\$3.8 million). Visual arts received the second largest amount of funding (\$3.1 million).
- Funding to artists and arts organizations in Vancouver totaled \$13.0 million, comprising 74% of the total funding going to British Columbia. The city of Victoria received \$1.7 million in funds, representing 10% of total funding. A total of 69 additional communities in British Columbia received \$2.7 million, or 15% of all funding to the province in 2001-2002.
- 97 British Columbia artists and arts professionals served as peer assessors in 2001-2002, making up 15% of all peer assessors.
- Over 2,200 applications from British Columbia artists and arts organizations were assessed in 2001-2002, representing 17% of the total number of assessed applications. The number of applications to British Columbia increased slightly between 2000-2001 and 2001-2002, by 10%.
- British Columbia artists and arts organizations received 14% of Canada Council funding in 2001-2002. In comparison, according to the 1996 Census, British Columbia makes up 13.6% of culture workers, and represents 13% of the total population of Canada.

## Aide attribuée à la Colombie-Britannique, 2001-2002

- En 2001-2002, le Conseil des Arts du Canada a accordé 17,5 millions de dollars aux arts de la Colombie-Britannique.
- Un montant de 1,2 million de dollars a en outre été payé à 1,900 écrivains et écrivaines de la Colombie-Britannique dans le cadre du Programme du droit de prêt public<sup>14</sup>.
- Le Conseil a accordé 3,6 millions de dollars en subventions à 376 artistes de la Colombie-Britannique, ainsi que 14,0 millions de dollars à environ 309 organismes artistiques de cette province.
- L'aide du Conseil a touché toutes les disciplines - danse, musique, théâtre, arts visuels, arts médiatiques, lettres et édition et art interdisciplinaire. Le plus gros pourcentage de l'aide est allé à la musique (3,8 millions de dollars), puis aux arts visuels (3,1 millions de dollars).
- Des subventions de 13,0 millions de dollars ont été accordées aux artistes et organismes artistiques de Vancouver, ce qui représente 74 p. 100 de l'aide à la province. La ville de Victoria a reçu 1,7 million de dollars (10 p. 100 du total). Les 69 autres collectivités de la Colombie-Britannique ont reçu en total 2,7 millions de dollars (15 p. 100 du total).
- 97 artistes et professionnels des arts ont été engagés comme membres de jurys, évaluateurs et conseillers en 2001-2002, ce qui représente 15 p. 100 de tous les membres de jurys auxquels le Conseil fait appel.
- 2,200 demandes d'appui présentées par des artistes et des organismes artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique ont été évaluées en 2001-2002, ce qui représente 17 p. 100 du total des demandes évaluées. Le nombre de demandes provenant de la Colombie-Britannique en 2001-2002 a augmenté de 10 p. 100 par rapport aux chiffres de 2000-2001.
- Les artistes et organismes artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique ont reçu 14 p. 100 des subventions du Conseil des Arts du Canada en 2001-2002. La province représente 0,1 p. 100 de la population totale du Canada. Pour fins de comparaison, la province compte 13,6 p. 100 de tous les emplois liés au domaine de la culture, et 13 p. 100 de la population canadienne.
