## Funding to British Columbia, 2004-2005

- In 2004-2005, the Canada Council for the Arts provided grants worth \$17.1 million to artists and arts organizations in British Columbia.
- In addition to grants, \$1.2 million in payments was provided to 2,085 authors through the Public Lending Right Program in 2004-2005<sup>1</sup>. This brings total Canada Council funding to British Columbia to \$18.3 million.
- Grant funding to British Columbia has increased by 20.3% over the past five years, from \$14.2 million to \$17.1 million.
- The Council awarded \$3.3 million (19%) in grants to 350 artists and \$13.8 million (81%) to 316 British Columbia arts organizations in 2004-2005.
- Grants were awarded to artists and arts organizations in British Columbia in all disciplines - dance, interdisciplinary and performance art, music, media arts, theatre, visual arts and writing and publishing. In 2004-2005, the largest amount of funding went to music (\$3.9 million). Visual arts received the second largest amount of funding (\$2.9 million) followed by theatre (\$2.6 million).
- Funding to artists and arts organizations in Vancouver totaled \$12.4 million, comprising 73% of the total funding going to British Columbia. The city of Victoria received \$1.8 million in funds, representing 10% of total funding. A total of 68 additional communities in British Columbia received \$2.9 million, or 17% of all funding to the province in 2004-2005.
- 116 British Columbia artists and arts professionals served as peer assessors in 2004-2005, making up 16% of all peer assessors. 99% of assessors from British Columbia were Anglophone, while 1% were Francophone.
- 2,618 applications from British Columbia artists and arts organizations were submitted to Council in 2004-2005, representing 15.8% of the total number of applications received.
- British Columbia artists and arts organizations received 14% of Canada Council funding in 2004-2005. In comparison, British Columbia makes up 18.4% of artists, and represents 13.2% of the total population of Canada.<sup>2</sup>
- "...British Columbians spent \$3.1 billion on cultural goods and services in 2003 or 3.3% of total consumer spending in the province. The \$3.1 billion in consumer spending on culture is four times larger than the \$760 million spent on culture in British Columbia by all levels of government in 2002/03. On a per capita basis, British Columbians' cultural spending is the third highest of all provinces at \$787 per resident".<sup>3</sup>

## Aide attribuée à la Colombie-Britannique, 2004-2005

- En 2004-2005, le Conseil des Arts du Canada a accordé 17,1 millions de dollars aux arts de la Colombie-Britannique.
- Un montant de 1,2 million de dollars a en outre été payé à 2,085 écrivains et écrivaines de la Colombie-Britannique dans le cadre du Programme du droit de prêt public<sup>4</sup> en 2004-2005, ce qui porte à 18,3 millions de dollars l'aide attribuée à la Colombie-Britannique.
- Depuis cinq ans, le total des subventions accordées à la province a augmenté de 20,3 %.
- Le Conseil a accordé 3,3 millions de dollars en subventions à 350 artistes de la Colombie-Britannique, ainsi que 13,8 millions de dollars à environ 316 organismes artistiques de cette province.
- L'aide du Conseil a touché toutes les disciplines - danse, musique, théâtre, arts visuels, arts médiatiques, lettres et édition et art interdisciplinaire. Le plus gros pourcentage de l'aide est allé à la musique (3,9 millions de dollars), puis aux arts visuels (2,9 millions de dollars) et au théâtre (2,6 millions de dollars).
- Des subventions de 12,4 millions de dollars ont été accordées aux artistes et organismes artistiques de Vancouver, soit 73 % de l'aide à la province. La ville de Victoria a reçu 1,8 million de dollars (10 %). Les 68 autres collectivités de la Colombie-Britannique ont reçu en total 2,9 millions de dollars (17 %).
- 116 artistes et professionnels des arts ont été engagés comme membres de jurys, évaluateurs et conseillers en 2004-2005, soit 16 % de tous les membres de jurys auxquels le Conseil fait appel. Parmi les évaluateurs de la Colombie-Britannique, on comptait 99 % d'anglophones et 1 % de francophones.
- 2,618 demandes d'appui ont été soumises au Conseil par des artistes et des organismes artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique en 2004-2005, ce qui représente 15,8 % du total des demandes reçues.
- Les artistes et organismes artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique ont reçu 14 % des subventions du Conseil des Arts du Canada en 2004-2005. La province compte 18,4 % de tous les artistes au pays, et 13,2 % de la population canadienne.<sup>5</sup>
- « ...les gens de la Colombie-Britannique ont dépensé 3,1 milliards de dollars pour des produits et services culturels en 2003, ce qui représente 3,3% des dépenses totales de consommation dans cette province. Ces 3,1 milliards sont quatre fois plus élevés que les 760 millions consacrés à la culture par tous les paliers de gouvernement de cette province en 2002-2003. Du point de vue des dépenses par personne, les dépenses au chapitre de la culture en Colombie-Britannique se classent au troisième rang de toutes les provinces, à 787 \$ par habitant. »<sup>6</sup>

## British Columbia Artists and Arts Organizations Funded by the Canada Council, 2004-2005

### Major Organizations

The Canada Council supports the work of major artistic organizations in each of the country's Provinces and Territories. In 2004-2005, among other British Columbia institutions to receive funding were:

### Supporting Diversity in Excellence

Council also supports professional artists and artistic organizations' endeavors through a great diversity of programs. The following selection illustrates the scope the projects supported by Council in British Columbia:

Well-known **Jane Siberry**, of Vancouver, was the laureate of a *Victor Martyn Lynch-Staunton Award* for music in 2005. The awards recognize one outstanding mid-career artist in each of the seven disciplines funded by the Canada Council. Siberry also received a \$14,000 grant through the Council's Grants to Professional Musicians (Individuals): Non-Classical Music program in 2004-2005. Siberry will utilize Council funds to compose music outside the regular song structure in terms of length; something akin to a musical or an opera. The new music will incorporate both single and choral elements, and classical Eastern and Western compositions. Siberry is known for her profound experimentation with various musical genres over twenty years and has performed with other known singers including k.d. lang, Joe Jackson, and Darol Anger.

Multidisciplinary performance artist collective **MythMakers**, established in Gibsons on BC's Sunshine Coast received a \$17,500 grant through the Council's Artist and Community Collaboration Fund in 2004-2005 to produce *Galactic FaerieTale*. *Galactic FaerieTale* is an adventure throughout time and space that weaves storytelling, mythological and imaginary characters, elaborate costumes, dancing, circus arts, theatre, puppetry, stilts, and poi, the art of fire-breathing, into one vibrant fantastical tale. *Galactic FaerieTale* premiered at the MannaFestival, an annual community gathering in Crystal Creek on the Sunshine Coast. MythMakers strive to empower youth, emerging artists, professional artists, and interested community members to hone their artistic skills and abilities.

Internationally acclaimed playwright, stage and film actress, and mental health advocate **Victoria Maxwell** of Sechelt, was awarded a \$2,000 grant through the Travel Grants to Theatre Artists program in 2004-2005

to attend and present ***Crazy for Life*** at the Giant Leap International Disability Arts Festival in Auckland, New Zealand. *Crazy for Life* portrays Maxwell's struggles with the conflicting euphoric and depressive episodes of bipolar disorder. *Crazy for Life* is an award-winning educational and entertaining one-woman biographical comedy that explodes "stigmas, myths and [reveals] glimpses of one face of psychiatric illness."<sup>7</sup>

Canada Council's Concert Production and Rehearsal Program for Aboriginal, Classical, Folk, Jazz and World Music awarded **Early Music Vancouver** with a \$25,000 grant in 2004-2005 to perform a concert series commemorating their 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Early Music Vancouver's repertoire spans from Middle Ages to the Late Romantic period. During their concert series, Early Music Vancouver will play *Echos of Venice*, *Christmas Oratorio*, *The Romantics*, *Continuo Conspiracy*, *Surprise! Haydn*, and *Sephardic Music*. In 2005, Early Music Vancouver established the first summer Vancouver Early Music Festival in conjunction with Festival Vancouver, which featured Baroque and Classical music.

Gitksan weaver **Frances Jackson** of Hazelton, was awarded an \$18,000 grant through the Aboriginal Traditional Art Forms Program in 2004-2005 to create a fishing net out of plant fibre. Using 5000 stinging nettles, Jackson will replicate sturdy fishing nets using the traditional methods of west coast Aboriginals. One of the few artists with netmaking skills, Jackson hopes to perfect the process in order to preserve west coast Aboriginal history and pass on the skills to peers and younger generations. Jackson also contributes to the local arts community through facilitating cedar bark weaving workshops for both children and adults.

In 2004-2005, **MediaEyes Production Society**, of Vancouver, was supported by a \$20,000 grant through the Council's Development Project Grants program. MediaEyes is a collective which aspires to expand media literacy, technological training, access to equipment for people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and bridge the gap between the deaf and hearing worlds. Council funds contributed to the development of ***Video Through Deaf Eyes***, a program that involves training and education in various aspects of media arts such as scriptwriting, storyboard creation, and production, for diverse deaf or hard of hearing individuals.

Letterpress printer, writer, and world traveler **Anik See**, of Madeira Park, received \$7,000 through the Council's Grants to Professional Writers: Creative Writing program to write ***Ritual*** in 2004-2005. *Ritual* reveals itself as a political commentary on the fine line between democracy and capitalism through character interactions. The characters undergo disillusionment which evolves while they compare their personal experiences with both democracy and capitalism. *Ritual's* characters include: Ani, an American immigration community centre worker with a South Asian background, the young idealist Ravi from Bombay, and Walter, Ani's alcoholic neighbour who was a former German soldier.

Vancouver-based storyteller **Melanie Ray** was awarded a \$10,000 grant through the Council's Spoken Word and Storytelling program to perform her own rendition of the legendary epic ***Tristan and Iseult*** throughout British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario, Quebec and Vermont in 2004-2005. *Tristan and Iseult* is a classical mediaeval romance with a connection to Arthurian tales and covers "action adventure, journeys, a dragon, love, sex, death, plots and sub-plots and counterplots, beauty, humour, magic, and fascinating characters."<sup>8</sup> Ray is a professional storyteller with extensive experience in giving performances in a variety of venues, from libraries to festivals.

In 2004-2005, North Vancouver's Gitksan performance troupe **Dancers of Damelahamid** received \$25,000 through the Council's Annual Support and Production Project Grants to Aboriginal Peoples

program. The Dancers of Damelahamid utilized Canada Council funds for various productions, including a series of Hagbegwatu songs and dances, and historical re-enactment of the one horned goat myth, *Koelhz Se Mos* (translated as Setting the Path), the *Mountain Goat Dance*, and the tale of the Gitksan prophet Beni. The Dancers of Damelahamid are active in the inclusion of youth especially in regalia and prop-making, and in preserving Gitksan culture and history through educational workshop and performances.

Richmond alternative band **Sekoya** promoted their music in festivals across the country with the assistance of an \$11,000 grant through the Council's Music Touring Grants Program in 2004-2005. During their tour from Victoria to Halifax, Sekoya was featured in the critically acclaimed Montreal International Jazz Festival's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary compilation CD. In 2005, Sekoya won a Canadian Indie Music Award in the Favourite Electronica Artist/Group category. Sekoya's music appeals to a wide audience and consists of a blend of nujazz, spoken word, electronica, soul and world music.

In 2004-2005, Delta film-maker **Naoko Sasaki** was awarded a \$16,000 grant through the Council's Grants to Film and Video Artists – Production Grants program to produce the 8 minute experimental film and visual poem *Awash*. *Awash* comments on the process of catharsis, the relieving of burdens and loads from the past, through the mundane domestic activity of washing dishes. While ambient sounds in *Awash* exist, neither music nor dialogue is used in order to allow the audience to experience raw emotions and feelings. Sasaki's films use everyday imagery and transform them into emotional and sensual experiences.

British Columbia's only professional Bharata Natyam dancer **Anusha Fernando**, of Vancouver, was awarded a \$10,000 grant through the Grants to Emerging / Mid-Career Dance Professionals program in 2004-2005. Council funds will contribute to Fernando's participation in private and group classes in both Austin, Texas and Delhi, India, as well as the largest annual performance festival in Chennai, India: the Madras Festival of Music and Dance. Fernando will also master her skills in the Bharata Natyam dance through intensive mentoring by Jayalakshmi Eshwar. Fernando's repertoire includes both pure dance pieces and dances for various feminine and androgynous Indian deities and other spiritual figures.

## Les artistes et les organisations artistiques de la Colombie-Britannique financés par le Conseil des Arts du Canada en 2004-2005

### À l'appui de l'excellence dans toute sa diversité

Le Conseil des Arts appuie en outre les projets d'artistes et d'organismes artistiques professionnels par l'entremise d'une vaste gamme de programmes. Le texte qui suit illustre bien la diversité des projets appuyés par le Conseil des Arts du Canada pour la Colombie-Britannique.

La réputée **Jane Siberry**, de Vancouver, s'est mérité le *Prix Victor-Martyn-Lynch-Staunton 2005*, volet musique. Ce prix est accordé à des artistes à mi-carrière en reconnaissance de leurs réalisations artistiques exceptionnelles. Sibery a aussi reçu en 2004-2005 une somme de 14 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme de subventions aux musiciens professionnels (à titre individuel) pour la musique non classique. L'artiste se servira de cette subvention du Conseil pour composer de la musique qui différera, sur le plan de la longueur, de la musique habituelle propre au chant et qui ressemblera davantage à une comédie musicale ou à un opéra. Sa nouvelle musique comprendra des solos autant que des chœurs, ainsi que des compositions classiques occidentales et orientales. Jane Siberry est reconnue pour les expériences poussées qu'elle fait avec divers genres musicaux depuis plus de vingt ans et pour ses prestations avec d'autres chanteurs connus comme k.d. lang, Joe Jackson et Darol Anger.

L'ensemble musical multidisciplinaire **MythMakers**, établi à Gibsons dans la région de Sunshine Coast, a reçu en 2004-2005 une subvention de 17 500 \$ grâce au Fonds de collaboration entre les artistes et la communauté, pour produire *Galactic FaerieTale*. *Galactic FaerieTale* est un voyage dans le temps et dans l'espace qui présente des narrations, des personnages mythiques et imaginaires, des costumes détaillés, des numéros de danse, de cirque, de théâtre, de marionnettes, de personnages sur échasses et de « poi », l'art des cracheurs de feu, pour en faire un conte fantastique époustouflant. Le spectacle a été présenté en première au MannaFestival, un rassemblement communautaire annuel à Crystal Creek dans la région de la Sunshine Coast. MythMakers s'efforce de donner aux jeunes, aux nouveaux artistes, aux artistes

professionnels et aux membres de la communauté intéressés la possibilité de perfectionner leurs habiletés et leurs compétences artistiques.

**Victoria Maxwell**, porte-parole de la santé mentale, actrice et dramaturge reconnue dans le monde entier, qui vit à Sechelt, a reçu en 2004-2005 une subvention de 2 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme de subventions de voyage aux artistes du théâtre, pour assister au Giant Leap International Disability Arts Festival, à Auckland, en Nouvelle-Zélande, et y présenter *Crazy for Life*. *Crazy for Life* traite de la lutte de Maxwell aux prises avec des épisodes contradictoires d'euphorie et de dépression causés par le trouble bipolaire. *Crazy for Life* est une comédie biographique solo, éducative, divertissante et primée, qui fait exploser les « stigmates et les mythes et qui [révèle] un aperçu d'un aspect de la maladie psychiatrique ».<sup>9</sup>

Le programme de répétition et de production de concerts de musique autochtone, classique, folk, jazz et de musiques du monde du Conseil des Arts du Canada a accordé à **Early Music Vancouver** une subvention de 25 000 \$ pour 2004-2005, en vue d'une série de concerts soulignant le 35<sup>e</sup> anniversaire de cette formation. Le répertoire d'Early Music Vancouver s'étend de la période du Moyen Âge à celle du romantique tardif. Pendant sa série de concerts, Early Music Vancouver interprétera *Echos of Venice*, *Christmas Oratorio*, *The Romantics*, *Continuo Conspiracy*, *Surprise! Haydn* et de la musique séfarade. En 2005, Early Music Vancouver a lancé le premier festival estival Vancouver Early Music Festival en collaboration avec Festival Vancouver, qui présente de la musique baroque et classique.

La tisseuse gitskane **Frances Jackson** de Hazelton, a reçu en 2004-2005 une subvention de 18 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme d'aide aux formes traditionnelles des arts visuels autochtones, pour créer un filet de pêche à partir d'une fibre végétale. À l'aide de 5 000 grandes orties, M<sup>me</sup> Jackson fabriquera des filets de pêche robustes selon les méthodes traditionnelles des Autochtones de la côte Ouest. Étant l'une des rares artistes à posséder des habiletés de fabrication de filets, Frances Jackson espère perfectionner le processus afin de préserver l'histoire autochtone de la côte Ouest et transmettre ses habiletés aux membres de sa communauté et aux générations futures. Elle contribue également à la communauté artistique locale en animant des ateliers de tissage d'écorce de thuya pour les enfants et les adultes.

En 2004-2005, on a accordé à **MediaEyes Production Society**, de Vancouver, une subvention de 20 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme d'aide aux organismes de production en arts médiatiques, pour les projets de développement. MediaEyes est un collectif qui aspire à approfondir l'étude des médias, les formations technologiques et l'accès à de l'équipement pour les personnes sourdes ou malentendantes, ainsi qu'à combler le fossé entre le monde des sourds et celui des personnes non sourdes. Les fonds du Conseil ont contribué au développement de *Video Through Deaf Eyes*, un programme axé sur la formation et l'éducation dans divers aspects des arts médiatiques comme la scénarisation, la création de scénarimages et la production pour les personnes sourdes ou malentendantes.

La typographe, écrivaine et globe-trotteuse **Anik See**, de Madeira Park, en C.-B., s'est vu octroyer en 2004-2005 une subvention de 7 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme de subventions aux écrivains professionnels pour la création littéraire, afin d'écrire *Ritual*. *Ritual* se veut un commentaire politique sur la mince ligne qui sépare la démocratie du capitalisme, le tout illustré par des personnages. Ceux-ci perdent leurs illusions au fur et à mesure qu'ils comparent leurs expériences personnelles face à la démocratie et au capitalisme. Les personnages de *Ritual* sont Ani, une Américaine aux racines sud-asiatiques qui travaille dans un centre communautaire d'immigration, Ravi, un jeune idéaliste de Bombay et Walter, le voisin alcoolique d'Ani qui est un ancien soldat allemand.

La conteuse de Vancouver **Melanie Ray** a reçu une subvention de 10 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme d'aide à la littérature orale (création parlée et conte) pour présenter sa propre interprétation du légendaire conte épique *Tristan et Iseult*, en Colombie-Britannique, en Alberta, en Ontario, au Québec et au Vermont en 2004-2005. *Tristan et Iseult* est une histoire d'amour médiévale classique, qui a un rapport avec les contes du roi Arthur et qui parle « d'aventures, de voyages, d'un dragon, d'amour, de sexe, de mort, d'intrigues, d'intrigues secondaires et de vengeance, de beauté, d'humour, de magie et de personnages fascinants ».<sup>10</sup> Ray est une conteuse professionnelle dont l'expérience est impressionnante et qui s'est produite en différents endroits, que ce soit dans des librairies ou à des festivals.

En 2004-2005, la troupe de danse gitskane de North Vancouver, **Dancers of Damelahamid**, a reçu 25 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme d'aide annuelle et de subventions de projet de production aux Peuples autochtones. Les Dancers of Damelahamid ont utilisé les fonds de Conseil des Arts du Canada pour diverses productions, dont une série de chants et de danses Hagbegwatku, ainsi que la reproduction historique du mythe de la chèvre à une corne, de *Koelhz Se Mos* (qui se traduit par « Tracer le chemin »), de la **Mountain Goat Dance**, ainsi que de l'histoire du prophète gitskan Beni. Les Dancers of Damelahamid favorisent l'intégration des jeunes, surtout pour la fabrication d'ornements et d'accessoires, de même que la préservation de la culture et de l'histoire gitskane au moyen d'ateliers éducatifs et de prestations.

Le groupe alternatif de Richmond, **Sekoya**, a fait la promotion de sa musique dans différents festivals du Canada grâce à la subvention de 11 000 \$ qu'il a reçue en 2004-2005, dans le cadre du programme de subventions aux tournées en musique. Pendant sa tournée, qui l'a amené de Victoria à Halifax, Sekoya a figuré sur le CD compilation du 25<sup>e</sup> anniversaire du Festival international de jazz de Montréal, encensé par la critique. En 2005, Sekoya a gagné un *Canadian Indie Music Award* dans la catégorie « Artiste ou groupe électronique de l'année ». La musique de Sekoya s'adresse à un large public et est constitué d'un mélange de nouveau jazz, de paroles parlées, d'électronique, de soul et de musique du monde.

En 2004-2005, le cinéaste **Naoko Sasaki** de Delta a mérité une subvention de 16 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme de subventions aux artistes du cinéma et de la vidéo pour la production, afin de produire le film expérimental et poème visuel de huit minutes intitulé *Awash*. *Awash* est un commentaire sur le processus de catharsis, qui consiste ici à éliminer les fardeaux du passé en s'adonnant à une tâche ménagère quotidienne, le lavage de la vaisselle. Bien qu'il y ait des sons ambiants dans *Awash*, il n'y a cependant ni musique ni dialogue permettant à l'auditoire de vivre des émotions et des sentiments à l'état pur. Dans ses films, Sasaki utilise des images de tous les jours et les transforment en expériences émotionnelles et sensuelles.

La seule danseuse professionnelle de Bharata Natyam de la Colombie-Britannique, **Anusha Fernando**, de Vancouver, a obtenu en 2004-2005 une subvention de 10 000 \$ dans le cadre du programme de subventions aux professionnels de la danse début/mi-carrière. Les fonds du Conseil permettront à Anusha Fernando de suivre des cours privés et de groupe à Austin, au Texas, et à Delhi, en Inde, et de participer au plus important festival annuel de Chennai, en Inde : le Madras Festival of Music and Dance. M<sup>me</sup> Fernando perfectionnera également ses talents de danseuse de Bharata Natyam grâce au mentorat intensif de Jayalakshmi Eshwar. Son répertoire comprend des danses authentiques et des danses en l'honneur des différentes déesses féminines et androgynes de l'Inde, et d'autres personnages spirituels.
