
Alberta Agricultural Research Institute Annual Report 2005/2006 A Year in Review

AARI is responsible for providing leadership, coordination and funding for Alberta's agri-based research and innovation system which will ensure that Alberta's agricultural sector continues to grow and prosper.

Key Activities

Activities undertaken by AARI over the 2005-2006 fiscal year support the directions established by the Alberta Science and Research Authority, and also support the Alberta Innovation and Science Business Plan 2005-08, Goal 5: Accelerate innovation in the life sciences sector.


- In partnership with the Alberta Livestock Industry Development Fund (ALIDF), the Institute for Food, Agri-Industrial and Agricultural Sciences (IFASA) partners, industry players and other stakeholders, AARI assisted in developing two multi-million dollar research programs in the areas of Bovine Genomics and Value-Added Meats.
- In partnership with the industry and other members of the Agriculture Funding Consortium (including ALIDF, the Alberta Crop Industry Development Fund, Alberta Barley Commission, Alberta Pork, Alberta Milk and the Agriculture and Food Council), facilitated the review of the Barley Development Program, Alberta Swine R&D Program, the Canola Breeding Program, and the Conjugated Linoleic Acid (CLA) Network projects. These reviews were essential in determining future investment in these focus areas based on the long-term opportunities for Alberta, and to ensure that the investments made towards these activities are relevant to industry needs.
- Reach and Discover, the agriculture publication created and funded by AARI and members of the Agriculture Funding Consortium, won the Best of CAMA (Canadian Agricultural Marketing Association) Award.
- Management of the R&D funding investment portfolio: There was continued growth in the BioProducts and Health and Nutrition sectors and increased funding from AARI and members of the Agriculture Funding Consortium was targeted towards these emerging areas.
- AARI continued to provide strategic leadership and guidance to the members of the Agriculture Funding Consortium. The members of the Funding Consortium continued to align their funding investments with the priorities identified by the industry. There was a significant increase in the level of investment in the areas of BioProducts and Value-Added product development.
- AARI continued to leverage its investments in R&D with investments from other members of the Funding Consortium, industry and other levels of government.
- Partnerships with the Alberta Heritage Foundation for Medical Research were forged and continued effort is being focussed on building stronger linkages between agriculture and health. The Fall 2005 edition of *Reach and Discover* focussed exclusively on Health and Agriculture and also included an editorial from Dr. Kevin Keough (President and CEO of AHFMR) entitled "Linking Agriculture and Human Health".

- AARI continued to invest in the Oil and Lipid Utilization Program and assisted in the development of a BioIndustrial R&D strategy for Alberta.
- Alberta was successful in its bid to host the 2007 Agricultural Biotechnology International Conference (ABIC). ABIC 2007 will be held in Calgary from September 23 26, 2007. AARI continues to play a key role in the organization and leadership for ABIC 2007.

Financial Details

AARI Investment Portfolio for 2005/2006 Fiscal Year:

AARI's 2005/06 budget of \$8,675,000 was invested in three key areas: BioProducts, Sustainable Production and Health & Nutrition.
