POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's mid-year population growth between 2004 and 2005 remains the strongest among the provinces. As of July 1, 2005, Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,256,816. This represents a yearly increase of approximately 52,000 persons (or 1.62% growth) from July 1, 2004. British Columbia and Ontario had the next largest growth rates at 1.25% and 1.08%, respectively.

The following chart shows both population estimates and growth rates of Canada and Alberta since 2001 for July 1.

Population estimates for July 1, 2005 for all provinces and territories are provided below in Table 2. Also shown are the estimated growth rates for the twelve-month period ending July 1, 2005.

MIGRATION

During the second quarter of 2005, Alberta had an estimated total net migration of 10,900 people (4,200 international and 6,600 interprovincial). Alberta had the largest number of interprovincial net migrants in Canada, followed by British Columbia. All other provinces, except for P.E.I., had negative net interprovincial migration (more people moving out of province than in). The origin and destination of interprovincial migrants are shown in Table 3 on the next page.

As shown in Table 3, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the second quarter was British Columbia, followed by Ontario and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of interprovincial outmigrants from Alberta.

NATURAL INCREASE

Between April 1 and June 30, 2005, Alberta experienced an estimated natural increase (births minus deaths) of around 5,500 people. The province had approximately 10,500 births and 5,000 deaths during the second quarter of 2005.
