





NORTH DAKOTA OVERVIEW

- North Dakota is Alberta's 18th largest export market, averaging nearly \$600 million annually over the last five years.
- North Dakota produces much of their power using Lignite, an efficient coal product.
- In 2005, Alberta exports to North Dakota totalled more than \$652 million including propane, fertilizers, electricity, and oil seeds.
- In 2005, North Dakota sent soya bean oil, corn, sunflower-seed, and wheat bran to Alberta.
- May 2006: Governor Hoeven attended the Leader's Summit in Gimli, Manitoba as part of the Western Premiers Conference. Premier Klein was also in attendance.
