The International Governance Office (IGO) is a group of individuals who work as part of the Government of the Province of Alberta, Canada. The IGO has more than 20 years of experience providing governance advice and training in many parts of the world. Specifically, the IGO:

- → acts as a first point of contact for *information* and advice on governance projects for international financial institutions and partners,
- → co-ordinates Alberta Government expertise in international governance projects, and
- creates partnerships between the Alberta public sector, private sector, academic institutions and non-governmental organizations in pursuit of international governance projects.



WHY USE THE IGO?

The IGO can harness the Alberta public sector's expertise to support capacity building and

institutional strengthening initiatives. - → The lowest overall tax level in Canada
- In a 2004 KMPG survey of 63 OECD cities, Edmonton ranked 2nd and Calgary 7th for most competitive business environments.
- A 2003 OECD study found that Alberta students finished among the top three in the world in standardized testing.
- Alberta has numerous schools with bilingual programs that provide up to 50% of instruction in one of 10 languages other than English, such as Arabic, German, Mandarin, Spanish or Ukrainian.
