Acting on the plan

Some of the steps already taken in achieving the plan include:

- The provincial debt is paid off.
- 70% of the provincial budget is invested in health, education and infrastructure.
- A \$6.8 billion capital plan, including a number of world-class infrastructure projects will put the province well ahead of the pack. Projects include: a world-class cardiac centre of excellence, a state of the art bone and joint centre, hundreds of modernized schools and roads, and a new animal disease testing lab.
- Research is already leading to more innovative ways of extracting oil from Alberta's oil sands and developing medical breakthroughs such as the Edmonton Protocol for Diabetes.
- Some of the best and brightest scientists, researchers and doctors are moving to Alberta.

- Innovations like HealthLink are improving services. Providing 24-hour access to medical experts over the phone has reduced unnecessary visits to emergency rooms.
- Alberta has the most comprehensive water strategy in Canada and is taking action on climate change, protecting natural areas and upgrading and preserving provincial parks.
- The province is implementing a six-point BSE recovery strategy and has a rural development plan.
- Through increased manufacturing, research and technology, the province's value-added strategy aims to develop more innovative and knowledge-intensive industries in Alberta.

UNLEASHING INNOVATION

- Research, technology and innovation will allow Albertans to maximize traditional industries through enhanced recovery and use of oil, gas and coal reserves; more environmentallyfriendly production methods; and development of new products.
- Research, technology and innovation will broaden Alberta's economy in the fields of biosciences, life sciences, information technology and nanotechnology.
- Develop investment markets, venture capital and early-stage financing to promote product development and production in Alberta so researchers, scientists, and entrepreneurs live and work here and sell their products to the world.
- Balance development with the need to protect air, water and land, and maximize these natural resources for all Albertans now and into the future. This environmental stewardship will be achieved through initiatives such as the Clean Air Strategy, the Water for Life Strategy and a new land-use strategy.
