MEAL, TRAVEL & ACCOMMODATION ALLOWANCES: WITNESSES & JURORS MAY 01/06 CHANGES IN RATES

April 1st, 2005 the Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation under the Public Service Act, Part 4, s. 8 (Meals) and Part 6, ss. 15 & 16 (Travel) was amended.

- Meal allowances payable by "parties to witnesses and jurors in civil litigation proceedings" were increased (see below) and
- Per kilometre allowance for travel by private automobile was increased from \$0.12/km to \$0.13/km).

- April 19th, 2005 the *Alberta Rules of Court, Schedule E, Number 3, s. 5(b)* was amended by AR 56/2005 OC 190/2005 to provide that the "amounts payable by parties to witnesses and jurors in civil proceedings" for travel by private automobile is changed from section 16 of the *Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation* to section 15.
 - Per kilometre allowance for travel by private automobile was increased from \$0.13/km to \$0.405/km.

- October 1st, 2005 the Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation under the Public Service Act, Part 6, s. 15 (Travel) was amended.
 - <u>Per kilometre allowance</u> for travel by private automobile was increased from \$0.405/km to \$0.43/km).

- May 1st, 2006 the Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation under the Public Service Act, Part 4, s. 8 (Meals) was amended.
 - <u>Meal allowances</u> payable by "parties to witnesses and jurors in civil litigation proceedings" were increased (see below).

- May 1st, 2006 the Edmonton Taxation Office conducted its annual survey of downtown hotels and a new *mean* rate was determined *for Edmonton only*. For other judicial centres please contact the local taxing officers.
 - In 2006 the Taxing Officer in Edmonton is allowing <u>accommodation</u> at \$110.00 per night, plus 11.5% Federal Hotel tax, plus GST.

In short, meal and accommodation allowances are increased slightly and witness "mileage" fees are substantially increased: see table below.

Because the **Court of Queen's Bench Costs Manual** is undergoing revisions and is not yet ready for posting on this web site, we present these changes by means of this "notice" posted to the site.

Below are the proposed changes to the relevant portions of the **Manual**; that is, to several entries in the **Disbursements** portion of the **Costs Between Parties** segment of the **Manual**.

Accommodation - **Schedule E**, **Number 3**, **Item 3** allows for the reasonable cost of accommodating a witness. In some circumstances parties to the litigation and their solicitor(s) may be entitled to recover the costs of accommodation.

The amount will no doubt vary from venue to venue, but in Edmonton a survey of downtown hotels is undertaken yearly and a mean rate established. In 2006 the Taxing Officer in Edmonton is allowing \$110.00 per night plus Federal Hotel tax and GST.

Note: room service and beverages are allowed to the limit addressed in "Meals", below.

Note too: dry cleaning, laundry, pay-per-view T.V., video rentals, massages and the like are considered luxuries, not necessities. In long trials some exceptions may be made.

Legal Counsel's Expenses - In question are expenses for meals, accommodation and travel. When allowed they are usually the same as the amounts allowed to a witness. (See: Accommodation, Meals & Travel Expenses)

Meals - Schedule E, Number 3, Item 4 provides an allowance for meals to witnesses and jurors.

In Calgary and Edmonton it has become the practice of the taxing officers to apply the meal allowance set out in the **Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation under the Public Service Act** - Part 4 - S. 8. As of May, 2006 it was the following (add on GST):

Breakfast	\$8.50
Lunch	\$10.75
Dinner	\$19.20
Per Diem for Meals	\$38.45

Process Servers - To the extent that the charge is reasonable it is an allowable disbursement (see *Maclin U-Drive Ltd. v. Western Plastics Ltd.* (Alta District Court) (1963) 42 W.W.R. 64).

In Edmonton the present practice of the Clerk of the Court is to allow **43 cents per kilometer** traveled, to disallow a fee for preparation of an Affidavit of Attempted Service (it is a legal service covered by **Schedule C**, **Item 6** or **7**, Application for Substitutional Service), and to disallow any "Administration Fee."

The **43 cents/km** is derived from the **Subsistence**, **Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation** under the **Public Service Act** - Part 6 - S. 15. The regulation may be found at http://www.pao.gov.ab.ca/legreg/travel/index.html and clicking on "Part 6".

Travel Expenses - "Mileage" for travel by private auto by a witness or juror is, as of October 1st, 2005, **43 cents per kilometer**. Mileage for a solicitor, where allowed, is the same. The amount will vary as **Schedule E, Number 3**, **Item 5 (b)** is tied to the Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation under the Public Service Act - Part 6 - S. 15.
