# The GAIN Program - Quick Facts -Gaming Information for Charitable Groups-

#### What is the GAIN program?

 The GAIN program was developed to help volunteers gain a better understanding of key information related to charitable gaming licences.

#### Why was this program developed?

- During consultations with charitable groups, our stakeholders told us that we need to give them better access to and more information on charitable gaming policies.
- We value Alberta's volunteers and we have developed this program in order to assist them.

#### How will GAIN benefit groups?

 The GAIN program will provide a valuable service to charitable groups by helping them gain a better understanding of the responsibilities and requirements of a gaming licence.

## What topics does the GAIN session cover?

- The areas of training will reflect the life cycle of a charitable gaming event; what charitable groups will need to know before, during, and after holding a licensed gaming event.
- The program will cover the following key areas:
  - Legislative and regulatory requirements of charitable gaming in Alberta.
  - Organizations eligible for gaming licences.
  - ➤ Licensing application process.
  - Eligible uses of proceeds.
  - Requirements to hold a charitable gaming event.
  - Financial reporting requirements after the gaming event.

# What topics does the Use of Proceeds session cover?

- The Use of Proceeds session will specifically focus on policies around the use of proceeds, including:
  - > Approvals for gaming proceeds.
  - Eligible use of proceeds categories.
  - > Time limits.
  - > Appeal processes.

#### How long is the training session?

- Each session will take approximately two and one half hours.
- There will be an opportunity during the session to ask questions.

#### Who should attend the training?

- Members of charitable or religious organizations, and volunteer or not-for-profit groups.
- Any interested individuals or groups.

#### When did the program begin?

- The GAIN program was made available to charitable and volunteer groups beginning in November 2003 through province-wide training sessions.
- A new Use of Proceeds session was added beginning July 2005.
- A quarterly training schedule is available on the website.

#### How many have completed training?

 Approximately 10,300 individuals representing over 5,300 groups have completed a GAIN training session.
