MANDATE

In accordance with the *Gaming and Liquor Act*, the *Criminal Code (Canada)* and within the policy framework established by the provincial government, the mandate of the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission is to:

- license, regulate and monitor gaming and liquor activities in Alberta;
- define operating policies and procedures for gaming and liquor activities;
- ensure integrity in the operation of gaming and liquor activities;
- collect gaming and liquor revenue;
- ensure business and program operations are run efficiently and effectively;
- disburse provincial lottery revenues;
- support industry and government initiatives to address problem gambling and responsible alcohol consumption; and
- communicate to gaming and liquor stakeholders accurate and timely information.

The Commission administers the Alberta Lottery Fund under the provisions of the *Gaming and Liquor Act*.

CHARITABLE GAMING MODEL

Overview

Alberta has adopted the charitable model for casinos, bingos, pull-tickets and raffles. These gaming activities may only occur when eligible charitable or religious groups apply for and receive licences to conduct the gaming activities.

The Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC) endeavours to ensure, through the setting of appropriate policies, procedures and terms and conditions for these various gaming activities, that the financial return to charitable and religious groups is maximized for the benefit of the charitable organizations, the programs and activities they deliver and the communities in which these activities are undertaken. The AGLC seeks to ensure, as a part of its mandate, that the integrity of gaming is maintained through ongoing reviews of these gaming activities, the licensing process, and enforcement of policies, procedures and terms and conditions.

Eligibility Requirements

A charitable or religious group is eligible for a licence to conduct gaming activities if the group:

- actively delivers a program or service which provides a benefit to a significant segment of the community. The program or service must be reasonably available to all members of the general public who qualify and wish to participate in that program or use that service.
- uses revenue from its gaming activities for a charitable or religious objective or purpose.

Structure

To be eligible for licensing the applicant groups must:

- have a broad based volunteer membership;
- have an executive democratically chosen from its volunteer base;
- not pay its members, directors or officers;
- have programs which benefit a large segment of the community, not the individual members' self interest;
- be a not-for-profit organization;
- have volunteers who are responsible for establishing, maintaining control of, and delivering the group's programs; and
- be incorporated (if a licence fee is required).

Community Benefit

Alberta's Charitable Gaming Model requires that proceeds from gaming activities provide a benefit to the community. The following are some **examples** for which charitable gaming activities benefit the community at large.

Eligible Groups

The types of groups who are eligible to obtain licences to conduct charitable gaming activities can be categorized as follows:

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
Agriculture	Organizations registered under the Alberta Societies Act or Agricultural Societies Act as an agricultural fair or exhibition board.
Arts	Performing visual and literary arts groups which focus on art galleries, dance, general and instrumental music, choral, opera, theatre, historical and multicultural organizations, museums and archives. This also includes marching, school and youth bands, and related groups such as parent associations and booster clubs.
Community	Groups whose activities are of a general nature that support a variety of programs in the community (for example, community associations, community leagues).
Education	Organizations including playschools, kindergarten, preschools, private schools, parent organizations in support of educational programs, colleges, technical institutions and universities.
Medicine-Health	Organizations assisting those afflicted with a specific physical or mental disorder; organizations supporting basic medical research; and, auxiliaries or support groups to health care facilities and people who are physically disabled.
Multiculturalism	Organizations which identify themselves with a country of specific ethnic origin and whose activities are of a general nature that support a wide variety of programs in the community.
Recreation	The organizations' activities are not of a competitive nature. They may include support for recreational facilities, parks and recreation organizations, among others.
Religion	Churches, parishes, temples, synagogues and auxiliary groups which support the religious activity and focus to further religious principles and objectives.
Senior Citizens	Organizations where the majority of membership is 60 years of age or older. Includes resident "clubs" in senior citizen homes and groups providing recreational and social activities for senior citizens.
Service	Fraternal, service and veteran organizations which are established by a statute or international/national "charter".
Social Action	Organizations which focus on specific issues of social concern and promote these issues through social and educational programs.
Sports	Organizations which support competitive amateur individual and team sports.
Youth	Organizations providing a variety of programming for young people, and including auxiliary groups in support of these organizations.
