Water Management Facilities

2006 - 09 Government of Alberta Capital Plan*

\$13.3 billion infrastructure investment over three years including:

- \$3.6 billion in provincial highways
- \$3.1 billion for municipal infrastructure grant programs
- \$2.9 billion for healthcare facilities and equipment
- \$833 million for schools
- \$1.1 billion for post-secondary facilities
- \$277 million for water and wastewater management
- \$376 million for community facilities and centennial projects
- \$668 million for government facilities and equipment
- \$372 million for small, emerging capital needs
