



# Alberta Public Opinion Research

May, 2005

#### Method



- 506 telephone interviews with adults 18+ across Alberta
  - Representative sample of households
  - Representative sample of adults within household
- Data were weighted at tabulation to reflect actual population characteristics by region, sex and age
- The survey was approximately 20 minutes in length
- Fieldwork was conducted from May 13 − 16, 2005





### Overview

#### Overview



- With high energy prices and a booming economy,
   Albertans are feeling good about their personal circumstances today and optimistic about the future.
- Their top-of-mind issues remain health care and education.
- Other issues, although far behind health care and education, include the economy, mad cow, seniors, and taxes.

#### Albertans' Priorities



- When asked what their priorities were, everything was important.
- Health care and education are at the top of the list.
- Other key factors include:
  - Fiscal management
    - Spending wisely
    - The economy
    - Saving for the future

- Debt reduction was low on the list, not surprising as Alberta has just eliminated its debt
- Other important areas:
  - Social services
  - Seniors
  - Helping farmers
  - Human rights

#### Health Care



- Albertans support the following initiatives:
  - Giving Regional Health Authorities more freedom to try new ways for service delivery
  - Offering more health care choice, even if it means delivering through private clinics
  - 3. More publicly funded/privately delivered services
- They also favoured spending options like hiring more doctors and nurses, building more hospitals, and eliminating premiums
- The public is split on user fees to prevent abuse of the system
- They welcome innovation but are less supportive if it means "bending the rules."

#### Education



- Education is the key issue after health care.
- Generally Albertans believe the system is of high quality and is in good shape relative to the rest of Canada.
- Top of mind concerns focus around cost and access for post-secondary education.

#### Education



- The Alberta public strongly support the following actions:
  - 1. Hiring more teachers to reduce class size
  - 2. Spending more to upgrade and repair schools
  - 3. Eliminating user fees and fundraising for essentials like books and computers
- Given their concerns about rising tuition costs and access for colleges and universities, they would likely welcome relief in these areas as well.
- Raising teacher salaries was a much lower priority.


### Other Topics

  - Restoring dental and eye care for seniors, addressing housing


## Alberta as a Place to Live Now vs. a Year Ago






### Alberta as a Place to Live A Year From Now






# Personal Circumstances vs. A Year Ago





### Personal Circumstances Expected A Year From Now










# How Good a Job is the Provincial Government Doing?






# How Good a Job is the Government Doing? Alberta versus Federal


