

Alberta SuperNet is a high-speed broadband network that spans the province, connecting 4,200 schools, hospitals, libraries and government facilities.

Alberta SuperNet Points of Presence (PoPs) are the network hubs in rural SuperNet communities. The PoP connects the community to the rest of the network...and to the world.

Did you know that Alberta SuperNet is longer than the entire TransCanada Highway, which took 12 years to build?




TransCanada Highway, Roger's Pass, BC




TransCanada Highway, Cabot Trail, Nova Scotia

Did you know that Alberta SuperNet contains what is believed to be the longest wireless link of its kind? Can you guess what community required this longdistance wireless link?






Alberta SuperNet's wireless link to **Fort Chipewyan** is believed to be the longest of its kind!

ADSL/Cable 640kbps






SuperNet 10/5 Mbps


E-Learning

- Alberta SuperNet allows rural hospitals to use ehealth applications such as telehealth, and access more learning opportunities




E-Libraries






