

Alberta Service Centres and Canada-Alberta Service Centres

Alberta Service Centres are places where Albertans go to get hands-on employment, career, and training information and assistance. The services available at each office will vary with community size and needs. Some centres are staffed full-time and others part-time. A collection of AHRE publications and forms is available.

Alberta Service Centres provide services and/or information about:

- hands-on career and employment assistance, including help with resumé writing, looking for work in the local labour market, and career planning
- employment and training programs and services
- intake for Alberta Works Income Support
- Child Support Services
- Job Corps
- Disability Related Employment Supports

There are 59 service locations in the province.

Canada-Alberta Service Centres provide all the programs mentioned above, as well as intake for federal Employment Insurance assistance, both for maternity/parental and unemployment benefits

There are 17 CASCs in the province.

Some CASCs and ASCs house Labour Market Information Centres (LMICs) – multi-media resource centres with an extensive range of career-related information to help Albertans make career, learning and work decisions.
