Proposal: Capital Health Region has submitted a proposal to amend an existing agreement with:

The facility is accredited by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta. The scope of work in amended agreement involves surgical procedures specific to the provision of medically necessary and insured services under the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan.

This contract expires March 31, 2008

The facility has a sufficient number of qualified and appropriately trained staff to manage the volume of work. There is no negative impact on the health workforce available to service the needs of the Capital Health Region. The physician has proven qualifications and experience in the provision of these surgical services. Physicians must be part of the region's medical staff and hold privileges; as such they are subject to the region's medical staff bylaws. Mechanisms are also in place to monitor physicians' compliance with the *Medical Professions Act.*

Assessment Alberta Health and Wellness conducted it due diligence in reviewing the proposal as per the *Health Care Protection Act* and according to the established Ministry Criteria for *Health Care Protection Act* agreements. The proposal meets those criteria and responds effectively to the region's responsibility for ensuring timely access to ophthalmology surgical services. The proposal also adheres to provincial and federal legislation.

- **Compliance:** The provider has had an agreement with Capital Health Authority since 2000, for the provision of these services. I am satisfied that the proposal from Capital Health provides a public benefit, and shows no adverse impact on our pubic health system, or our ability to comply with the *Canada Health Act*.

in the public sector. This is important as it allows the major centers in the
