

# Alberta Population Report

June 25, 2003

First Quarter, 2003

## POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth between April 1 of 2002 and 2003 is again the strongest among the provinces. As of April 1, 2003, Alberta's population is estimated to be 3,146,066. This is an increase of approximately 47,000 persons (or 1.52% growth) from April 1, 2002. Ontario and Prince Edward Island had the next largest growth rates at 1.10% and 0.85%, respectively.

The following chart shows both population estimates and growth rates of Canada and Alberta since 1997 for April 1.

Population estimates for April 1, 2003 for all provinces and territories are provided below in Table 2. Also shown is the growth rate of population between April 1, 2002 and April 1, 2003.

## MIGRATION

Between January 1 and March 31, 2003, Alberta had an estimated net interprovincial migration of 5,328 people. This makes up the majority of total net migration (interprovincial and international) to Alberta. Alberta had the largest number of interprovincial net migrants in Canada, followed by Ontario. The origin and destination of interprovincial migrants are shown in Table 3 on the next page.

As shown in Table 3, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the third quarter was British Columbia, followed by Ontario and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

## NATURAL INCREASE

Statistics Canada estimates that Alberta experienced a natural increase (births minus deaths) of about 4,400 people between January 1, 2003 and March 31, 2003. Approximately 9,400 births occurred in this quarter, while there were an estimated 5,000 deaths.
