

# Alberta Population Report

December 18, 2003

Third Quarter, 2003

## POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth between October 1 of 2002 and 2003 continues to be the highest among the provinces. As of October 1, 2003, Alberta's population is estimated to be 3,164,400. This is an increase of about 38,900 persons (or 1.24% growth) from October 1, 2002. Ontario and British Columbia had the next largest growth rates among the provinces at 1.11% and 0.85% respectively.

The following table shows the population estimates and growth rates of Canada and Alberta since 1996 for October 1.

Population estimates for October 1, 2003 for all provinces and territories are provided in Table 2 below. The population growth rates for the twelve-month period ending October 1, 2003 are also shown.

## MIGRATION

Between July 1 and September 30, 2003, Alberta had an estimated net interprovincial migration of 3,100 people. This is slightly over 58% of total net migration (interprovincial and international) to Alberta. Alberta had the largest number of interprovincial net migrants in Canada, followed by British Columbia. The origin and destination of interprovincial migrants are shown in Table 3 on the next page.

As shown in Table 3, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the third quarter was British Columbia, followed by Ontario and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

## NATURAL INCREASE

During the third quarter (July 1 to September 30, 2003), Alberta experienced a natural increase (births minus deaths) of 5,300 people. The province had 9,800 births versus 4,500 deaths in this quarter.
