William Love (Calgary)

Chair

Background

The Public Health Appeal Board (The Board) was established February 03, 1999 under the amended *Alberta Public Health Act*. The new Public Health Appeal Board replaced the former Public Health Advisory and Appeal Board established in 1985.


The board is subject to general rules of administrative law and natural justice as they apply to quasi-judicial tribunals. Donald R. Cranston, Q.C., of the law firm Bennett Jones LLP provides the board with independent legal counsel.

Duties

The Public Health Appeal Board is a five-member panel recommended by the Minister of Alberta Health and Wellness and appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council. Their principal duty is to hear appeals on decisions made by regional health authorities (RHA). The board's role is to address concerns of individuals directly affected by an RHA decision.

The board may call upon technical experts and professionals to assist and provide them with specific knowledge in areas related to the appeal. At the completion of the appeal, the board gives written notice of their decision. This may:

- confirm, reverse or vary the decision of the RHA or
- refer the matter back to the RHA for further consideration.



Appeal Activities and Summaries

The following is a summary of all appeals or applications received and/or heard by the Public Health Appeal Board from January 01, 2003 to December 31, 2003:

01/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to replace or modify windows in order that they comply with the Minimum Housing and Health Standards and the Alberta Building Code.

The appellant withdrew the appeal.

02/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to assess the water infiltration of the two units of the housing premises.

The appellant withdrew the appeal.

03/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of two orders of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, declaring the housing premises unfit for human habitation and requiring the occupant to vacate the premises.

The board upheld the orders issued by the executive officer of Capital Health. The appellant was directed to have the premises remain vacant while correcting the conditions identified in the order to the satisfaction of an executive officer of Capital Health.

04/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to undertake certain cleaning and sanitizing of a residential suite.

Hearing held March 25, 2003

The board upheld the order issued by the executive officer of Capital Health.

05/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to correct the private sewage disposal system.

The appellant withdrew the appeal.

06/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to correct heating, water infiltration and various housing conditions to an apartment building.

The order was resolved between the parties and the appeal was accordingly withdrawn.

07/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the owner to correct the size of openings between balusters in residential apartments.

The hearing is scheduled to be heard in February 2004.

08/2003

A letter of appeal was received regarding a health issue not pertinent to the board's jurisdiction.

The appellant was directed to the appropriate source.

09/2003 Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, declaring the housing premises unfit for human habitation and requiring the occupant to vacate the premises.

Hearing held September 17, 2003

The board varied the order issued by the executive officer of Capital Health. The appellant was to correct the window sizes to allow emergency egress, and install a guard on the open side of each staircase.

10/2003 Order of Chinook Regional Health Authority

Appeal of two orders of an executive officer of Chinook Regional Health Authority under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* declaring the housing premises unfit for human habitation and requiring the occupant to vacate the premises.

Hearing held November 6, 2003

The board upheld the orders issued by the executive officer of the Chinook Regional Health Authority. The appellant was to correct heating and various housing conditions identified in the orders before permitting further occupancy of the premises.

11/2003

Order of Peace Country Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Peace Country Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the occupant to vacate the premises due to water and sewage disposal systems.

Hearing held October 31, 2003

The board varied the order issued by the executive officer of Peace Country Health. The appellant was to install an approved septic system to the satisfaction of the Peace Country Health.

12/2003

Order of Peace Country Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Peace Country Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the occupant to vacate the premises due to water and sewage disposal systems.

The appellant withdrew the appeal.

13/2003

Order of Peace Country Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Peace Country Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the owner of the housing premises to ensure all occupants be supplied with adequate sanitary facilities, hot and cold water safe for human consumption, approved public sewage system, and to cease rental of mobile homes. The owner was not to permit further occupancy of the premises until authorized to do so by an executive officer of Peace Country Health.

Hearing held October 31, 2003

The board varied the order issued by the executive officer of Peace Country Health. The appellant was granted an extension of time to cease rental of the mobile home and to provide potable water to the mobile homes and one shop on this property.

14/2003

Order of Peace Country Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Peace Country Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the owner of the housing premises to ensure all occupants be supplied with adequate sanitary facilities, hot and cold water safe for human consumption, approved public sewage system, and to cease rental of mobile homes. The owner was not to permit further occupancy of the premises until authorized to do so by an executive officer of Peace Country Health.

Hearing held October 31, 2003

The board varied the order issued by the executive officer of Peace Country Health. The appellant was granted an extension of time to cease rental of the mobile home and an extension is given to the appellant and tenants to vacate the property.

15/2003

Order of Capital Health

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Capital Health under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the owner to correct heating, plumbing, electrical and various housing conditions of the premises.

The appellant withdrew the appeal scheduled for November 14, 2003.

16/2003

Order of Aspen Regional Health Authority

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of the Aspen Regional Health Authority under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act* requiring the owner to repair the potable water system.

The appellant withdrew the appeal.

17/2003 Order of Calgary Health Region

Appeal of the order of an executive officer of Calgary Health Region under Section 62 of the *Public Health Act*, requiring the owner to clean and abate a rodent infestation in the housing premises.

The order was rescinded, and the appeal was accordingly withdrawn.
