## 25 More Reasons . . .

### To nominate a student for the Premier's Citizenship Award

On November 21, 2005, Premier Klein announced the Alberta Centennial Scholarships Program. This program provides each province and territory with 25 scholarships, worth \$2,005 each.

In Alberta, all Premier's Citizenship Award recipients are considered nominees for the Alberta Centennial Scholarship. In other words, when you nominate a student for the Premier's Citizenship Award, that student will also be considered for the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal AND the Alberta Centennial Scholarship.

### Premier's Citizenship Award

- Recognizes students who support and contribute to Alberta communities through public service and volunteer endeavours in school sponsored, community or extracurricular activities.
- Each Alberta high school is allocated one award and is responsible for selecting a recipient from among their graduating students.
- Recipients receive a plaque and a letter of commendation from the Premier.

### Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal

- All Premier's Citizenship Award recipients are considered nominees for this award.
- A selection committee chooses the eight recipients.
- Recipients receive the Queen's Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal, a letter of commendation from the Lieutenant Governor, and \$5,000.

### Alberta Centennial Scholarship

- All Premier's Citizenship Award recipients are considered nominees for this award.
- After choosing the eight Queen Citizenship Medal recipients, the selection committee will determine the twenty-five Alberta Centennial Scholarship recipients.
- Students cannot receive the Queen Citizenship Medal and the Alberta Centennial Scholarship.
- Recipients of this award must be enrolling in post-secondary studies in Canada.
- Recipients receive a congratulatory letter from the Minister and a cheque for \$2,005.

## IMPORTANT

- You must complete the "**Record of Accomplishments**" section of the application form for your nominee to be considered for the latter two awards.
