# **COURSE REQUIREMENTS- As of April 1, 2006**

Students who completed Grade 12 before April 1, 2006 will be assessed using the previous course criteria.

#### **GRADE 10**

# Average of 80.0% or higher in 5 subjects:

- One of: English 10, English 13, English 10-1, 10-2, or Français 10, 13 or 10-2, and
- At least two of the following:
  - Pure Mathematics 10, or Applied Mathematics 10
  - Science 10
  - Social Studies 10
  - A language other than the one used above at the Grade 10 level (1000 series), and
- Any two other three credit courses at the Grade 10 level (1000 or 4000 series) including those listed above and combined introductory C.T.S. courses.

#### **GRADE 11**

#### Average of 80.0% or higher in 5 subjects:

- One of: English 20, English 23, English 20-1, 20-2, or Français 20, 23 or 20-2, and
- At least two of the following:
  - Pure Mathematics 20 or Applied Mathematics 20
  - Science 20
  - Biology 20
  - Chemistry 20
  - Physics 20
  - Social Studies 20
  - A language other than the one used above at the Grade 11 level (2000 series), and
- Any two other three credit courses at the Grade 11 level (2000 or 5000 series) including those listed above and combined intermediate C.T.S. courses.

# **C.T.S. Courses:** Three one credit modules can be combined and used as an option at the Grade 10 and/or Grade 11 level. Five one credit modules can be combined and used as an option at the Grade 12 level.

To be combined:

- all courses must be from the same level i.e. Introductory, Intermediate or Advanced,
- courses can be from different streams or subject area, i.e. computer courses with welding courses, and
- marks will be averaged.

# NOTES:

- French and Français are not the same course, and are not interchangeable.
- Only marks obtained prior to post-secondary study can be used
- ➤ A course cannot be repeated after a higher level course has been taken in the same series.
- > Eligibility is restricted to grades obtained while a resident of Alberta.
- ➤ Driver Education, Work Experience and Special Projects will not be used when calculating a student's average.
- > Options used in Grades 10 and 11 must have a three credit value.
- > Options used in Grade 12 must have a five credit value.
- > Averages are not rounded up for scholarship purposes.
- ➤ Regarding CALM, this course can be taken in any grade but the final mark will be calculated in Grade 11.
- ➤ IB courses can be used as core subjects for Grade 10 & 11
- ➤ IB language at the Grade 12 level is accepted providing language taken is different from the main language.
- ➤ LDC courses are acceptable for Grades 10, 11 and 12.

### **GRADE 12** – Effective April 1, 2006

#### Average of 80.0% or higher in 5 subjects:

- One of: English 30, English 30-1, 30-2, or Français 30, 30-2, and
- At least two of the following:
  - Pure Mathematics 30
  - Applied Mathematics 30
  - Mathematics 31
  - Science 30
  - Biology 30
  - Chemistry 30
  - Physics 30
  - Social Studies 30
  - Any **one** language other than the one used above at the Grade 12 level (3000 series).
- Any two other five credit courses at the Grade 12 level (3000 or 6000 series) including those listed above and combined advanced C.T.S. courses.
