ALBERTA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

The Government of Alberta is committed to encouraging and rewarding the excellence of Alberta students by offering scholarships through the Achievement Scholarship program, the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund, and need-based bursaries.

Achievement Scholarships

Established in the year 2000 by the Government of Alberta, the achievement scholarships recognize the excellence of Alberta students. The program includes the Jason Lang Scholarship, the Jimmie Condon Athletic Scholarship and the Graduate Student Scholarship.

Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund

Created by a \$100 million endowment from the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund, the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund is designed to stimulate the pursuit of excellence by rewarding outstanding achievement and by encouraging and assisting Albertans to achieve their fullest potential.

Bursaries

Alberta Scholarship Programs also administers the Northern Alberta Development Bursary, Northern Student Supplement, Alberta Opportunities Bursary and the Canada Millennium Bursary.

Unless otherwise indicated, an applicant must be an Alberta resident.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Academic

Alexander Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship

Over 9,000 scholarships are available to recognize and reward exceptional achievement at the high school level and to encourage students to continue their studies. The scholarships are awarded to students achieving a minimum average of 80.0 per cent in five designated subjects in Grades 10, 11 and 12. The scholarships have a value of \$400 for Grade 10, \$800 for Grade 11, and \$1,300 for Grade 12 with a total value of up to \$2,500. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in a post-secondary program of at least one semester in length or be an apprenticeship student.

Application Deadline: May 1 for September entry; December 1 for January entry

Rutherford Scholar

The top ten students graduating from Grade 12, are selected on the basis of diploma examination results in English 30-1 (or 30-2), or Français 30 (or 30-2), Social Studies 30 and three other diploma examination subjects. Recipients receive a plaque and \$1,500 in addition to their Alexander Rutherford Scholarship.

Candidates are selected from applications for an Alexander Rutherford Scholarship submitted before August 1.

Grant MacEwan United World College Scholarship

Eight scholarships are awarded for two years of study at a United World College. These awards are based on academic ability, leadership capability, references and an interview. Applicants must be in the process of completing Grade 11.

Application Deadline: February 15

Adult High School Equivalency Scholarship

A total of 200 scholarships of \$500 each are available to students who have been out of high school for three years and have completed an upgrading program at an eligible school in Alberta. Awarded on the basis of academic achievement and recipients must be continuing their studies full-time in a post-secondary program. Recipients are nominated by the educational institution where they completed their upgrading program.

Dr. Ernest and Minnie Mehl Scholarship

One \$3,500 scholarship will be awarded to a student graduating from an Alberta high school and enrolling in a post-secondary degree program. The recipient will be selected based on diploma examination marks, financial need, and personal commitment.

Application Deadline: June 1

Anna & John Kolesar Memorial Scholarship

One \$1,200 scholarship will be awarded to the applicant with the highest average in three designated Grade 12 subjects.

Applicants must be planning to enroll in an Education program and be from a family where neither parent has a university degree.

Application Deadline: July 1

Citizenship

Premier's Citizenship Award

To recognize students graduating from high school who have supported and contributed to Alberta communities through public service and voluntary endeavours. Recipients will receive a plaque and a letter of commendation from the Premier. One award is available for each high school in Alberta.

Nomination Deadline: June 15

Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal

To commemorate the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002, eight most outstanding recipients of the Premier's Citizenship Award will receive a Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal, a letter of commendation from the Lieutenant Governor, and a \$5,000 award.

Nomination Deadline: June 15

Recipients are selected from Premier's Citizenship Award nominees.

Alberta Centennial Premier's Scholarships

This scholarship was established to commemorate the Province of Alberta's Centennial. Twenty-five awards of \$2,005 each are available to students entering any level of post-secondary study at any university, college, technical institute or apprenticeship program in Canada.

High school students pursuing post-secondary studies may also be eligible for the Charles S. Noble Scholarship for Study at Harvard, Fellowship for Full-time Studies in French, and need based bursaries. These awards are all listed elsewhere in the brochure.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS (continued)

Scholarship recipients are selected from nominations received for the Premier's Citizenship Award. Students cannot receive both the Alberta Centennial Premier's Scholarship and the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Citizenship Medal.

Nomination Deadline: June 15

Recipients are selected from Premier's Citizenship Award nominees.

Athletics

Earl and Countess of Wessex - 2001 World Championships in Athletics Scholarship

This scholarship was created to commemorate the visit of the Earl and Countess of Wessex to the 8th International Amateur Athletics Foundation World Championships in Athletics held in Edmonton in August of 2001. The top track and field male and female Grade 12 student will each receive a \$3,000 award.

Applicants must meet an academic standard. Recipients will be selected based on their athletic accomplishments.

Application Deadline: October 1

Apprenticeship

Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) Scholarship

Up to 500 awards of \$1,000 each are available to high school graduates who have completed the RAP program and are continuing in an approved regular apprenticeship program. Recipients are chosen on the basis of academic merit, employer recommendation, a recommendation letter from a high school teacher or counsellor and a personal essay.

Application Deadline: June 30

High School Specific

Janet and Horace Allen Scholarship

One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded to the top science graduate from **Crowsnest Pass High School** and has enrolled full-time in a post-secondary institution. Application forms are available from the school counsellor.

Application Deadline: June 1

Carmangay Home and School Association Scholarship

One scholarship of approximately \$2,000 will be awarded to a student who attended **Carmangay School**. The Carmangay Home and School Association established this scholarship when Carmangay School closed in 2001.

Application Deadline: August 1

Dr. Robert and Anna Shaw Scholarship

Three awards of \$500 each are available to students graduating from **Sexsmith Secondary School** and are pursuing post-secondary studies. Awards are based on academic merit and leadership accomplishments.

Application Deadline: June 1

Contact high school counsellor

Dr. Robert Norman Shaw Scholarship

One scholarship of \$1,500 to a student graduating from **Sexsmith Secondary School** and pursuing post-secondary studies in a health-related field. Awarded on the basis of achieving the highest average on five Grade 12 (level 30) subjects: English or Français, Mathematics, Social Studies, Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Science.

Application Deadline: June 1

Helen and George Kilik Scholarship

One scholarship of \$1,000 is available to a student from **Olds High School** who is in financial need, has been involved in extra-curricular activities, and has shown academic success. The recipient is selected by a selection committee at Olds High School.

Application Deadline: June 1

Aboriginal

Alberta Blue Cross Scholarship for Aboriginal Students

Three scholarships valued at \$500 - \$1,250 are awarded to aboriginal students completing high school and planning to pursue post-secondary studies in Alberta. Recipients are chosen based on academic achievement, financial need and community involvement.

Application Deadline: June 1

Other

Boys and Girls Clubs of Alberta Scholarship

Each year three \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students who are or were members of one of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Alberta. Awards are based on academic merit, a letter of recommendation and information submitted by the sponsoring Boys and Girls Club of Alberta.

Application Deadline: July 1

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS (continued)

Central Alberta Rural Electrification Association Scholarship

For children of Central Alberta Rural Electrification Association members. Two scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded to students graduating from high school based on academic merit and an essay describing their career goals.

Application Deadline: July 1

Alberta Press Council Scholarship

One scholarship of \$1,000 available to students graduating from an Alberta high school. Selection is based on an essay on a specified topic. Essay topic is available in December.

Application Deadline: January 15

Stream-Flo/Master Flo Scholarship

For children of Stream-Flo, Master Flo, or ERC Industries employees. Two awards of \$2,000 for graduating students enrolling in a university, university transfer program, or at a technical school in Alberta, Saskatchewan or British Columbia. Awards may be renewed.

Application Deadline: July 31

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Academic

Louise McKinney Post-Secondary Scholarship

Approximately 950 scholarships of \$2,500 each are awarded to students continuing into the second or subsequent year of post-secondary study. Awards are based on academic achievement. Students enrolled in programs within the province are nominated by the awards office of eligible institutions. Students studying outside Alberta because their program of study is not offered in Alberta should contact Alberta Scholarship Programs.

Jason Lang Scholarship

Approximately 15,000 scholarships of \$1,000 each are awarded to post-secondary students enrolled in an undergraduate or professional program at eligible post-secondary institutions in Alberta. The minimum required average is 3.2 on a 4.0 grade point scale in the qualifying year of study. Students who meet the eligibility criteria are nominated by the participating Alberta post-secondary institution.

Nomination Deadline: October 15, and February 15.

"Persons Case" Scholarship

These awards recognize students whose studies will contribute to the advancement of women, or who are studying in fields where members of their sex are traditionally few in number. Selection is based on program of studies, academic achievement and financial need. Awards range in value from \$1,000 to \$5,000. A maximum of \$20,000 is available each year.

Application Deadline: September 30

Charles S. Noble Scholarship for Study at Harvard

Three scholarships of \$10,000 are awarded to students for undergraduate study at Harvard. The awards are co-sponsored by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund and an endowment established by Edmonton businessman Sandy Mactaggart.

Application Deadline: May 15

Leadership

Laurence Decore Award for Student Leadership

A total of 100 awards of \$500 each are available to recognize outstanding leadership in the areas of student government, student societies, clubs or organizations at the post-secondary level. Students who meet the eligibility criteria are nominated by the participating Alberta post-secondary institution.

Nomination Deadline: March 1

Lois Hole Humanities and Social Sciences Scholarship

Four scholarships of \$5,000 each are available to students enrolled full-time in the second or subsequent year of post-secondary study in the Faculty of Humanities or the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Alberta, the University of Calgary, the University of Lethbridge, and Athabasca University. Awarded on the basis of academic merit, demonstrated leadership and community service.

Nomination Deadline: October 15 and November 15

Undergraduate students may also be eligible for need based bursaries. These awards are listed elsewhere in this brochure.

Language Programs

Fellowship for Full-time Studies in French

Approximately 300 awards are available to students taking full-time post-secondary studies taught in French in any discipline, anywhere in Canada. Awards are valued at \$500 to \$1,000 per semester.

Application Deadline: November 15

Languages in Teacher Education Scholarship

Thirteen scholarships of \$2,500 each are available to students enrolled in a Bachelor of Education program in Alberta and studying a language other than English. Students are nominated by the Faculty of Education.

Nomination Deadline: November 1

Athletics

Jimmie Condon Athletic Scholarship

Approximately 2,000 scholarships of up to \$1,800 each are awarded to students enrolled full-time at universities, colleges and technical institutes in Alberta, are members of a designated team and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 or greater on a 4.0 grade point scale.

Nomination Deadline: November 1

Charles S. Noble Junior Football Scholarship

A total of 30 scholarships of up to \$1,000 each are awarded to junior football players who are currently enrolled full-time at a post-secondary institution in Alberta. Nominations are made by the respective teams. The awards are co-sponsored by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund and the three Alberta teams in the Junior Football League.

Nomination Deadline: October 1

Contact team coach or manager.

Charles S. Noble Junior "A" Hockey Scholarship

Ten scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded to individuals who have participated in Junior "A" Hockey and are currently enrolled full-time at a post-secondary institution in Alberta. Nominations are made by the respective teams. The awards are co-sponsored by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund and the Junior "A" Hockey League.

Nomination Deadline: December 1

Contact team coach or manager

Prairie Baseball Academy Scholarship

Up to \$40,000 in scholarships of between \$500 and \$2,500 are awarded to post-secondary students who are also participants in the Prairie Baseball Academy. Applicants must be full-time post-secondary students in Alberta and have achieved a minimum GPA of 2.0 or greater on a 4.0 grade point scale in the previous semester. Recipients are chosen based on academic standing, community involvement, and baseball achievements.

Application Deadline: October 15

Apprenticeship

Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship

Approximately 170 scholarships of up to \$1,000 each will be awarded to apprenticeship students who have completed at least their first period of formal training. Applicants must be registered Alberta apprentices in any of the designated trades or occupations.

Application Deadline: July 31

Aboriginal

Aboriginal Health Careers Bursary

Approximately \$200,000 in bursaries are awarded to aboriginal students enrolled in a health field at a post-secondary institution. Applicants must be Indian, Inuit, or Métis and have been residents of Alberta for a minimum of three years prior to applying. The value of each bursary varies between \$1,000 and \$10,000.

Application Deadline: May 1

Theodore R. Campbell Scholarship

One scholarship of \$1,500 is awarded to an aboriginal student enrolled in the second year of a University Transfer Program in Education at Blue Quills First Nations College.

Robert C. Carson Memorial Bursary

Five awards of \$500 each are available to aboriginal students enrolled full-time in the second year of Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice Diploma or Faculty of Law at eligible Alberta post-secondary institutions.

Nomination Deadline: October 1

CANA Scholarship

One award of \$1,500 and two awards of \$1,000 are available to children of CANA and ACE Construction employees. The scholarships recognize and reward exceptional academic achievement. Applicants must be entering their second or subsequent year of study at a designated institution in Canada or the United States. For more information visit the following website: www.cana.ab.ca

Other

Alberta Barley Commission - Eugene Boyko Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship of \$500 is awarded to a student entering the second or subsequent year of post-secondary study in Alberta and is enrolled in courses with an emphasis on crop production and/or crop processing technology.

Application Deadline: August 1

International Education Award - Ukraine

Five \$5,000 awards are available to students taking a practicum, internship, co-op, or apprenticeship program. Students must be from Ukraine and studying in Alberta or from Alberta and studying in Ukraine. One term research projects may also be considered.

Application Deadline: January 1

GRADUATE STUDENTS

Graduate Awards

Sir James Lougheed Award of Distinction

Fifteen awards are available to recognize academic excellence and provide Alberta students with the opportunity for advanced study at institutions outside of Alberta. Awards are valued at \$15,000 for master level and \$20,000 for doctoral level study.

Application Deadline: February 1

Ralph Steinhauer Award of Distinction

Fifteen awards are available to recognize exceptional academic achievement of students studying within Alberta. Applicants must be Canadian citizens and enrolled or intending to enroll at an institution in Alberta. Scholarships are valued at \$15,000 for study at the master level, and \$20,000 for doctoral level study.

Application Deadline: February 1

Arts Scholarship - Graduate Level

Five awards of \$5,000 each for study at a master level or equivalent study in music, drama, dance, literary arts, and the visual arts.

Application Deadline: February 1

Alberta Ukrainian Centennial Alberta Commemorative Scholarship

Two awards annually are available to provide academic opportunities for a student from Ukraine to study in Alberta and for a student from Alberta to study in Ukraine. Scholarships are for graduate level study.

Application Deadline: February 1

Queen Elizabeth II Graduate Scholarship

To commemorate the Queen's visit to Alberta in May 2005, this scholarship is designed to reward the high level of achievement of students pursuing graduate studies in Alberta. Scholarships are valued at up to \$9,300 for study at the master level and up to \$10,500 for the doctoral level. Recipients are nominated by the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Graduate students may also be eligible for the Fellowship for Full-time Studies in French, "Persons Case" Scholarship, Northern Alberta Development Bursary, and Athletic Scholarships. These awards are all listed elsewhere in the brochure.

GRADUATE STUDENTS (continued)

Alberta Award for the Study of Canadian Human Rights and Multiculturalism

In recognition of Alberta's centennial and the contributions and experiences of Alberta's diverse population, the Minister of Community Development has established the Alberta Award for the Study of Canadian Human Rights and Multiculturalism. This award is intended to encourage graduate studies that will create value for Albertans by promoting informed thinking about Canadian human rights, cultural diversity, and multiculturalism; encouraging the pursuit of studies in Canadian human rights, cultural diversity, and multiculturalism; and building capacity to undertake human rights or multicultural work in Canada. One award of \$10,000 is available.

Application Deadline: March 1

Graduate Student Scholarship

To reward the outstanding academic achievement of students enrolled in the second-year of a master level program. One thousand scholarships of \$2,000 each are awarded to Canadian Citizens or permanent residents attending university in Alberta. Recipients are nominated by the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

iCORE Scholarships

The iCORE scholarships are designed to support outstanding graduate students in information science and engineering at Alberta universities. Recipients are nominated by the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Michael Luchkovich Scholarship for Career Development

For individuals who have demonstrated a high level of ability in the workplace and who wish to enhance their education or training through short-term study (up to six months full-time study) or part-time study (up to one year of part-time study). Applicants must have worked in Alberta for a minimum of three years. To assist with direct educational costs and award is disbursed upon confirmation of course completion.

Application Deadline: December 1, April 1, and August 1

Arts Scholarship - Career Development

To assist Alberta artists further their training through non-academic, short-term courses and internship or apprenticeship programs. Fields eligible for this award include: music, drama, dance, literary arts and the visual arts.

Application Deadline: November 15 and March 15

Alberta Motion Picture Industry Training Program

On-the-Job Training

An employer may apply to receive \$200 per week to hire a trainee for up to six months. The trainee must be an Alberta resident being trained by a qualified craftsperson in that position and cannot be replacing a qualified worker. Applicants may only receive one award per year. Only Alberta based companies may apply for this award.

Application Deadline: January 15, May 15, and September 15

Short Course or Seminar Grant

Available to individuals already established in the film and/or television industry who wish to further develop their skills by participating in short courses or seminars. Selection is made on the basis of individual merit. Funding is disbursed upon confirmation of course completion.

Application Deadline: January 15, May 15, and September 15

Language Teacher Bursary Program

For teachers who have current valid Alberta certification, have been teaching in Alberta for a minimum of three years or its full-time equivalent and are taking a summer post-secondary program in a language other than English or language pedagogy course.

Ten bursaries of \$5,000 and up to two bursaries of \$2,500 are available for study outside of Canada or study in Canada if language is only available in Canada, i.e. Aboriginal languages.

Application Deadline: February 10

Robin Rousseau Memorial Mountain Achievement Scholarship

For individuals active in the mountain community who intend to pursue a recognized Mountain Leadership and Safety Certification program. Selection is based on work record, volunteer activities, personal goals and how these relate to mountain safety. The scholarship typically ranges from \$500 - \$2,000.

Application Deadline: January 30

NEED BASED BURSARIES

Alberta Opportunities Bursary (AOB)

The Alberta Opportunities Bursary is available to students in high financial need who are entering their first or second year of post-secondary studies. Under this program, the Government of Alberta will grant non-repayable bursaries valued from \$500 to a maximum of \$1,500 to students attending participating institutions.

Students are automatically assessed for an AOB at the time of application for student financial assistance.

Canada Millennium Bursary (CMB)

The Canada Millennium Scholarship Foundation, an independent organization established by the Government of Canada, allocates \$28.2 million dollars each year to Alberta to be awarded as bursaries to Alberta students with high financial need.

Students may be awarded a bursary based on their assessed need from their initial application for student financial assistance.

Students must be in their second or subsequent year of undergraduate studies at a recognized institution in Canada. Bursaries are not awarded on appeal. Information about the Foundation and the Excellence Awards can be found on the following website: www.millenniumscholarships.ca

Students are automatically assessed for a CMB at the time of application for student financial assistance.

Millennium Alberta Rural Incentive Bursary

Established in partnership with the Canada Millennium Scholarship Foundation, bursaries of up to \$1,000 are available to rural Albertans attending a designated post-secondary institution in Canada. Rural Alberta is defined as any community outside of Edmonton, Calgary, Sherwood Park and St. Albert.

For students who have attended a rural high school in or worked in rural Alberta for a minimum of twelve months immediately before starting post-secondary studies, are attending a designated post-secondary institution in Canada, are enrolled in Year 1 or Year 2 of an undergraduate program of at least two years in length and, are eligible for a minimum of \$1,000 in student loan funding.

Students are automatically assessed for the bursary at the time of application for student financial assistance.

Northern Student Supplement (NSS)

Residents of northern Alberta may also be eligible for a Northern Student Supplement (NSS). Students must submit an application for the NSS. The value of the award varies from \$500 to \$1,500 depending on financial need.

Submit application for the NSS with an application for student financial assistance.

Northern Alberta Development Bursary (NADB)

These awards are designed to increase the number of qualified professionals in northern Alberta by providing bursaries to students committed to a life and career in northern Alberta. For Alberta residents who are within two years of completing their academic study. Awards are valued at up to \$3,000. Recipients are required to sign a contract to live and work in their field of study for one year within the Northern Alberta Development Council boundary upon graduation. Students have up to six months after graduation to find employment. Students unable to obtain employment in northern Alberta will be required to repay the entire bursary.

Application Deadline: May 15

Northern Alberta Development Bursary for Medical Students

This bursary follows the same eligibility criteria as the NADB. The value of this award is \$5,000. Recipients may be eligible for a bursary partnership as well. For more information on the Northern Alberta Development Council visit the following website: www.nadc.gov.ab.ca

Northern Alberta Development Bursary for Pharmacy Students

This bursary follows the same eligibility criteria as the NADB. The value of this award is \$3,000. Recipients may be eligible for a bursary partnership as well. For more information on the Northern Alberta Development Council visit the following website: www.nadc.gov.ab.ca

Northern Alberta Development Bursary Partnership Program

The bursary was established through contributions from northern businesses and communities, and is administered jointly by Alberta Scholarship Programs and the Northern Alberta Development Council. Businesses interested in becoming a sponsor should contact the Northern Alberta Development Council. The value of the bursary is up to \$1,500 for one year of study. Recipients are selected by prospective employers with assistance from the Northern Alberta Development Council. The length of time students are required to work in northern Alberta is based on the value of the bursary.

Information on these bursaries is available from all Alberta Service Centres and Canada Alberta Service Centres. Students receiving one of the above bursaries may also be eligible for other scholarships..
