

Alberta Population Report

March 24, 2005

Fourth Quarter, 2004

POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth for the Year 2004 continues to be the highest among the provinces. As of January 1, 2005, Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,223,415. This represents an annual growth of approximately 44,300 persons (or 1.40% increase) from January 1, 2004. Ontario and British Columbia tied for the next largest annual growth rates at 1.11%.

The following table provides the January 1 population estimates and yearly growth rates of Canada and Alberta since 1999.

Population estimates of January 1, 2005 for all provinces and territories are provided in Table 2 below. The estimated annual population growth rates for the Year 2004 are also included.

MIGRATION

For the fourth quarter of 2004 (October 1 to December 31), Alberta had an estimated total net migration of 6,100 people (3,700 interprovincial and 2,400 international). After trailing British Columbia in the previous two quarters, Alberta had the largest gain in interprovincial migration again during the fourth quarter.

As shown in Table 3, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the fourth quarter was British Columbia, followed by Ontario and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

On an annual basis, Alberta had a total of 11,600 net interprovincial migrants in 2004, the largest among all provinces. This is the eighth consecutive year that Alberta has maintained the highest interprovincial migration gain in Canada.

NATURAL INCREASE

In the fourth quarter, Alberta experienced a natural increase of over 4,500 people (9,500 births minus 5,000 deaths). During the Year 2004, Alberta had a total of 39,300 births and 19,700 deaths, resulting in a natural increase of 19,600 people.
