Cooperatives Act

November 2002

This document does not apply to extra-provincial cooperatives continuing or registering under the Cooperatives Act.

This document identifies what must be and what may be included in Articles of Incorporation for cooperatives that are continuing, or incorporating under Alberta's Cooperatives Act and includes the additional requirements for housing, multi-stakeholder, employment and new generation cooperatives.

Articles of Incorporation must be submitted when a cooperative continues or incorporates.

To help prepare your Articles, see the document *Articles of Incorporation Requirements* for information about what must be and what may be included in Articles.

Information for continuing Alberta-based cooperatives

Articles of Incorporation are new and will replace your Memorandum of Association. Some clauses from your Memorandum of Association and supplemental by-laws and the Standard By-laws found in the Co-operative Associations Act may be appropriate for your new articles.

In some cases, members may be required to vote on the Articles of Incorporation. See the instructions *Continuing an Alberta-Based Cooperative* for more details.
