The community was established in 1901 by Jesse Knight and was named after Jesse Knight's eldest son, Oscar Raymond Knight. In 1902, Raymond Knight organized the first Stampede, which has since become a well known annual event. The event has made Raymond known as the "Home of the First Stampede".

### **Waste Management**


Sewage treatment is provided by a series of lagoons consisting of 4 short and 2 long detention ponds and an evaporation pond.




# Raymond Population by Age Group (2001)

## **Raymond Highest Level of Schooling 2001**








# **Raymond Family Expenditures (1996)**






