Federal Constitution of the Swiss Confederation

Health and accident insurance (Art. 117)

- The Federal Government shall legislate on health and accident insurance
- · It can declare the health and accident insurance compulsory for the entire or parts of the population

Federal Constitution of the Swiss Confederation

Protection of health (Art. 118)

- · Within the limits of its powers, the federal government shall take measures for the protection of health.
- · It shall legislate on :
 - the handling of foodstuffs and of therapeutic products, narcotics, organisms, chemicals and articles that may be dangerous to health;
 - b. Efforts to combat communicable, widespread or malignant human and animal diseases;
 - c. Protection against ionizing radiation.

Responsabilities of cantonal authorities within the health system


In the absence of federal legislation, the cantonal authorities are responsible for taking measures to protect health


Assets of the Swiss health system


- Health outcome indicators among the best worldwide and continue to improve (exceptions: mental health, substance abuse)
