It also reflects its support for new opportunities, new ideas and new potential as rural Alberta moves forward to enjoy the full benefit of the Alberta Advantage.

A Place to Grow is an action-oriented document that strengthens and builds on existing inter-relationships between rural and urban communities. These actions are intended to build sustainable rural communities that were vital to our past and are just as vital to our future.







## guiding principles

- > The Government's role is to create a positive environment and work with rural communities to support locally developed initiatives, plans and projects
- > All Albertans should have access to essential services
- > Good stewardship of Alberta's land, air and water to focus on sustainability and preserving economic and quality of life advantages our environment provides
- > Action must be initiated and led at the local level

- > Action must allow flexibility and innovation, recognizing the unique needs of different communities and regions
- > Action must be collaborative, with cooperation among rural regions and communities, across & amongst governments and between urban & rural communities

#### four pillars

There are 4 key areas that are essential for sustainable rural communities. They are: economic growth; community capacity, quality of life & infrastructure; health care; learning and skill development.

#### priority actions

The following are some strategies that reflect what Albertans have clearly indicated are important and need addressing.

- > A Strong Voice for Rural Albertans, by:
  - Establishing a new Rural Citizen's Voice
  - Initiating a new dialogue process between Government Caucus and rural citizens
- > The Rural Alberta Gateway, can:
  - Provide access to information and services needed by rural Albertans
  - Enable rural Albertans to voice their concerns, so that they will be heard
- > Promote economic development, by:
  - Improving access to resources that will help communities to move forward
  - Encouraging tourists to experience the hospitality and uniqueness of rural Alberta

- > Build community capacity, particularly in:
  - · Leadership, rural & regional development
  - Arts, culture, heritage, sports & recreation
- > Improving access to healthcare, by:
  - Using rural hospitals more effectively to address rural and urban health challenges
  - Implementing access standards and guidelines for essential health services
- > Expand learning & skill development, by:
  - Using technology to improve access, teaching and learning in rural communities
  - Expand training opportunities for new professionals, apprenticeships & trades people
- > Sustain & enhance the quality of the environment by:
  - Maintaining a safe and secure water supply
  - Improving waste management processes
- > Provide opportunities for rural youth, by:
  - Developing community youth engagement strategies, youth entrepreneurship
  - Supporting their efforts to become involved in their local community
- > Engage and support seniors, by:
  - Expanding assisted living options
  - Removing transportation barriers
- > Encourage Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people to work together in all aspects of rural life, by:
  - Implementing the Government's Aboriginal Policy Framework
