Waste management is through the Kelsey Transfer Station, by the County of Camrose No. 22.

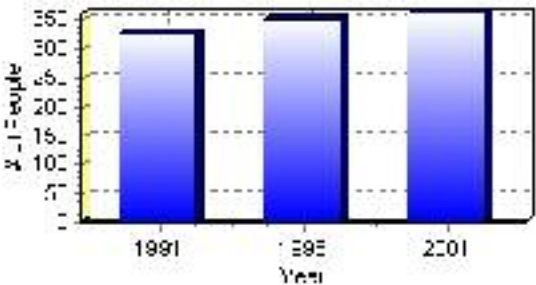

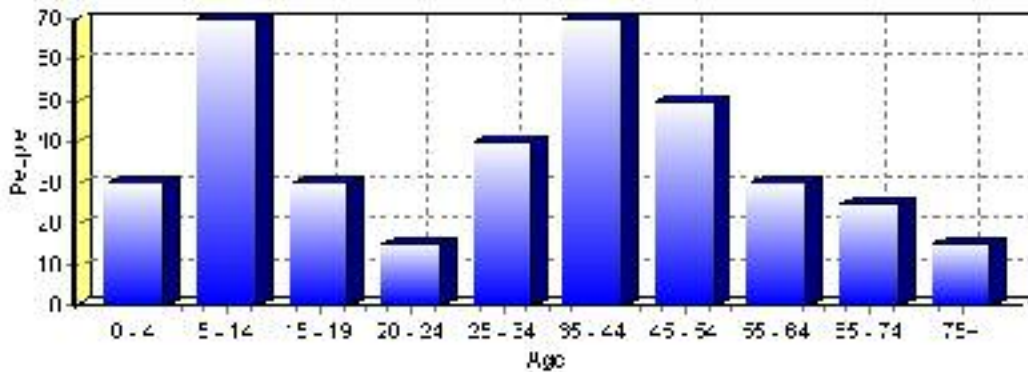

Bawlf Population by Age Group (2001)

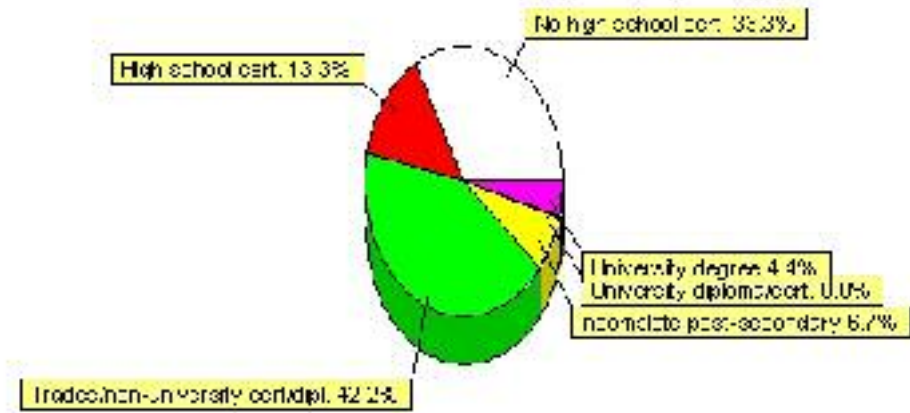

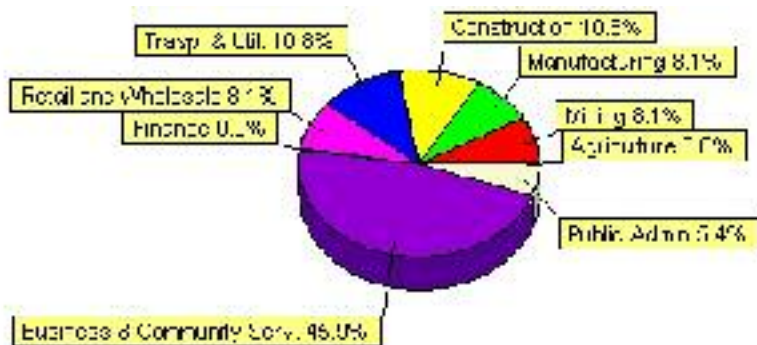
