Area Overview

Wainwright was incorporated as a town in 1910. At the time, Buffalo National Park was located immediately south of town, which was used to preserve the endangered bison. In 1940, the animals were removed and the land was turned over to the Department of National Defence, who established a training camp known as Camp Wainwright. Camp Wainwright, which has been extensively developed over the years and is now known as Western Area Training Centre, is one of the primary training areas in Canada, regularly hosting international exercises.

Today, Wainwright is a thriving community of 5,300 people. In addition to the defence industry, oil and gas as well as agriculture has resulted in Wainwright experiencing steady growth, a trend expected to continue in the future.


Waste Management










Wainwright Family Expenditures (1996)






