Mannville was named after J.D. Mann, a contractor for the Canadian Northern Railway. The site of the village was originally located 2 miles west of the present site and was moved in 1906. The first settlers to arrive in the area in 1899 travelled from Edmonton by oxen. In 1906 Mannville was incorporated as a village.

The source of water is 3 wells. The reservoir capacity, measured in treated substance is 1,000 cubic metres. The design capacity is 572 cubic metres.






## Mannville Population by Age Group (2001)



## Mannville Labour Force By Industry - 2001






