

# CHIROPRACTORS

Chiropractors diagnose and treat patients' disorders of the spine and other body joints by adjusting the spinal column or through other corrective manipulation. Chiropractors usually work in private practice.

#### **EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

Graduation from a chiropractic educational institution (college or university) that is accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education is required.

### **WORK EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS**

Previous work experience is not applicable in the process of credential assessment.

#### ASSESSMENT PROCESS

To be eligible to practice in Manitoba as a Chiropractor the candidate must first apply to the **Manitoba Chiropractors' Association (MCA)**. He/she must submit:

- a completed application form; (available from the MCA)
- original pre-chiropractic university transcript;
- transcripts from an accredited chiropractic educational institution;
- a recent notarized photograph;
- the names and addresses of two professional references; and
- an application fee of \$250.00.

\*If documents are in other than English or French, notarized translations are required.

#### Step One

Candidates must successfully complete the Canadian Chiropractic Examining Board's (CCEB) *Written* (Cognitive) and *Clinical Skills* examinations. Written examinations are offered twice a year at three Canadian sites and two U.S. sites. To write the examination in Canada the fee is \$900.00. To write it in the U.S. the fee is \$1000.00. *Clinical Skills* examinations are offered in Calgary, Toronto and Quebec. They are offered a minimum of three times per year. The fee is \$900.00

#### Step Two

Candidates must then write the *Provincial Jurisprudence Examination* administered by the MCA. The examination fee is \$75.00.

When all examinations and other prerequisites have been successfully completed and fees have been paid (annual registration fee is approximately \$3,000.00), the applicant is licensed and registered to practice as a Chiropractor in the province of Manitoba. He/she becomes a member of the Canadian Chiropractic Association.
