BE PART OF A STRONG ECONOMY

All across the province, in small and mid-sized cities, you'll find sophisticated, thriving centres of education, culture and industry. New Brunswick's economy has outperformed Canada's and other Canadian provinces' economies over the past several years as we have broadened our traditional resource base to emphasize manufacturing, tourism, research and development, and the knowledge industry. Our information technology industry in particular has an excellent international reputation, and Canada's National Research Council has chosen to establish its e-commerce centre of excellence here.

New Brunswick companies are well located to trade internationally. The province has several airports and worldclass seaports, and is connected to major North American rail lines and the I-95, a major United States Interstate Highway. The North America Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) allows New Brunswick-manufactured goods to enter the 400 million person U.S. market without duties and tariffs. New Brunswick is a gateway to the United States. Exports from New Brunswick have doubled during the past decade to reach \$8.2 billion. As manufacturing, services, and exporting levels have grown, employment in New Brunswick has also increased.

QUALITY EDUCATION IS PART OF THE ATTRACTION

New Brunswick's proud history of excellence in education is reflected today in its philosophy of lifelong learning. New Brunswickers receive free public schooling in either English or French from kindergarten (age 5) to Grade 12 (age 18). To expand their opportunities in a bilingual province and country, many children attend French immersion programs. Alternatives to the public school system also include private schools and home schooling.

Our five universities are well known for their expertise in the fields of engineering, forestry, nursing, high technology, law and social work. We are very proud to have the oldest engineering school, the first e-commerce degree in Canada, the first Multimedia degree in North America, and the first French-language Common Law program in the world.

Our 11 Community College campuses and over 100 private training facilities deliver courses in support of industry needs. Students enroll in one- to two-year programs leading to diplomas in technology, electronics, business, computer science and many other fields.

YOU'RE ENTITLED TO FREE BASIC HEALTH CARE

Free health care coverage, including most medically required services, is provided by the provincial government. Affordable health insurance can be purchased from major private sector insurers to cover excluded services, and for health care delivered outside of the province. You can also purchase insurance to protect yourself against unforeseen hardships such as loss of income due to serious illness or disability. Most employers offer additional coverage to their employees as part of their benefits package.





CAN YOU CONTRIBUTE TO LIFE IN NEW BRUNSWICK?

The Provincial Nominee Program

New Brunswick recognizes that immigration is a source of skills, entrepreneurship, expertise, international links, and capital, which create additional employment and investment. Through the Provincial Nominee Program, New Brunswick actively seeks qualified immigrants who will fill labour market shortages, or create employment and business opportunities here.

To be considered for nomination by New Brunswick. applicants must have a guaranteed job offer in their intended occupation or an approved plan to do business in New Brunswick.

Skilled workers require a permanent, full-time job offer from an established New Brunswick employer. The job must meet provincial employment standards and offer comparable industry rates of pay. In most cases, the skills offered by the potential immigrant are not readily available in New Brunswick and employers must demonstrate that they have attempted to find these skills in the Canadian job market. Business plan applicants are required first to submit a business evaluation form (available on our website), and if approved, make at least one exploratory visit to New Brunswick. During this trip, applicants are required to:

- research the business environment and consult with economic development agencies to identify opportunities related to their field of expertise;
- be interviewed by officials from the Department of Business New Brunswick to present their business plans and provide background information;
- explore education, housing and community facilities.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have relevant business experience and will actively participate in the business venture in a managerial role. They must also have sufficient funds to finance the first phase of the project without thirdparty assistance and to cover the cost of living expenses for the whole family for a period of up to two years. (The actual amount will depend on the specific business venture proposed.)

All applicants to our Provincial Nominee Program must make a commitment to live and work in New Brunswick. Final approval of an applicant, based on the individual's health and background check, is the responsibility of Citizenship and Immigration Canada. Nominee applications receive priorty.

PRIORITY BUSINESS SECTORS

We will consider projects that we determine economically feasible and fulfill the Program requirements. Cooperation and partnerships with existing New Brunswick companies are options if the joint ventures create economic benefits for the province. Examples of projects that could be considered

Tourism: establishment or purchase of hotels, motels, inns, campgrounds, cottages, restaurants, bed-and-breakfast facilities, tourists attractions, as well as service organizations who market tourism packages in markets/sectors where local providers are not sufficiently active. Manufacturing: establishment or purchase of a manufactuing/ processing facility, preferably with a value-added component in sectors such as:

- Metalworking/Machinery;
- Value-Added Wood;
- Fish/Food Processing (secondary value-added, underutilized species, export and specialty niche markets);
- · Plastics (specialty niche markets);
- · High-Tech Manufacturing (computers and related hardware, telecommunications, environmental technologies);
- · Health Care Products;
- Garments/Specialty Textiles.

Technology and Innovation: software development, advanced learning technologies, aerospace/defence.




