


CIPO's mandate

- The Canadian Intellectual Property Office (CIPO) is responsible for:
 - granting and registering intellectual property (IP) rights in Canada;
 - ensuring that the information acquired, in exchange for such rights, is made available to the public.

Types of IP

- Patents
- Trade-marks
- Copyrights
- Industrial designs
- Integrated circuit topographies
- Plant breeders' rights



Definition of invention

 An invention is any new and useful: — manufacture (lipstick);



- process (a method for making lipstick);
- machine (an apparatus for making lipstick);
- composition of matter (the chemical composition of lipstick);

or

any new and useful improvement of the above.

Definition of invention


• **90%** of patents are for improvements to existing patented inventions.

Definition of patent

- A patent protects inventors by giving them the exclusive right to exclude others from:
 - making;
 - using; or
 - selling their invention.

Definition of patent

 Protection for a maximum period of 20 years from the date on which the patent application is filed.



Definition of patent


- In exchange for this protection, the inventor must provide a detailed description of the invention.
- This way, Canadians can benefit from technological innovation and enhance their knowledge!

Utility of a patent

- Protects the inventor
- Encourages technological innovation and creativity
- Generates profit
 - sales
 - licence

Patentability criteria


- Novelty
- Inventive step
- Utility (industrial application)
- Unity of invention
- Clear language
- Patentable subject matter




Role of the Patent examiner


The Patent examiner :

- ensure compliance with the Patent Act and Patent Rules;
- write examination reports
- recommend or refuse the issuance of a patent.
