







04-05 Achievements - Bill C-29


- A major undertaking

- Entry into force of « Dutch » sections












CIPO started offering ISA services on July 26, 2004

- Positive impact upon all services provided by the Patent Branch






























05-06 Priorities – The College

- No guarantee of success but no efforts will be spared
















05-06 Priorities - Modernization of the *Trade-marks Act*

Madrid Protocol and Trademark Law Treaty


- We need to explore accession in the global context

- Trade-mark modernization is a shared responsibility













05-06 Priorities - Small Entities / Service Interruptions Regulations

- CIPO reviewing small entity definition, process for claiming small entity status, and possible relief mechanisms
- Consultation with IPIC on proposed conceptual framework
 will be undertaken in the next few weeks
- Regarding service interruptions, we need to define a "bright line" unworkable in my view if we leave all kinds of discretion to the Commissioner
- With both of these regulatory initiatives, the goal is greater certainty for stakeholders
















05-06 Priorities - Post-grant Opposition

- A Canadian Biotechnology Advisory Committee (CBAC) recommendation
- CIPO commissioned two studies: the first to examine systems in other jurisdictions, and the second to analyse the pros and cons of the different systems
- Hired Peter Davies to devise, from the above findings, a made-for-Canada proposal - will share with IPIC
- Very early in the process; still very far from reaching a conclusion or developing recommendations for Ministers






















International Developments

- WIPO 2004 General Assemblies Issues
 - SPLT Trilateral Proposal on "reduced package"
 - Traditional Knowledge / Genetic Resources
 - Development Agenda
- Outcomes
 - Trilateral Package was not accepted by developing countries
 - WIPO consultations to determine future role of SCP
















International Developments

- Feb. 2005 Washington Meeting Issues
 - How to move forward on substantive patent law harmonization
- Outcomes
 - Establish two sub-groups to deal with substantive patent and development issues with a goal to submit a feasible package to WIPO by September 2005
















- WIPO Informal Consultation in Morocco Issues

 - "4+2" proposal –trilateral proposal in SCP and disclosure and development agenda in IGC













CIPO's International Direction

- Work with like-minded IPOs, such as the UK and Australia, to arrive at best practices















Conclusion


- Have had some remarkable successes in the last year: Bill C-29; ISA/IPEA; CID Re-engineering

- Internationally to remain engaged and actively contribute towards multilateral initiatives.




