Under the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3, the Prince Edward Island Marketing Council makes the following Order:

MILK TRANSPORTATION RATE DETERMINATION ORDER

1. The words herein shall have the meanings as found in the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3, unless differentiated herein and as hereinafter defined. Interpretation

2. In this Order Definitions

(a) "Act" means the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3;

(b) "dairy" means a place where milk or cream is received for the purpose of being processed and sold as Class 1 milk;

(c) "dairy manufacturing plant" means a place where milk or cream is manufactured and processed into cheese, butter, evaporated milk, ice-cream, milk powder and other milk products;

(d) "milk" means the normal milk from cows but does not include farm separated cream;

(e) "primary transportation" means bulk transportation of all classes of milk directly from the producer's farm to a dairy or dairy manufacturing plant.

3. Pursuant to the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3, the primary transportation rate charged by transporters shall be determined by the Council using a bulk haulage cost formula. Rate

4. The bulk haulage cost formula referred to in section 3 shall include cost elements described in Appendix "A".

5. The bulk haulage cost formula referred to in section 3 shall factor into the rate determination data supplied by milk transporters for each route.

6. The primary transportation rate charged by a transporter shall be the weighted average cost for that transporter as determined by Council.

7. Where a transporter is required to deliver milk to a dairy or dairy manufacturing plant other than the one designated for a route or to travel an extra distance to deliver milk to a second dairy or dairy manufacturing plant, compensation for the extra distance travelled shall be at a per kilometer rate as determined by Council.

8. Council shall determine a minimum charge in cases where a transporter is required to make a special trip to pick up milk.
9. After the initial setting and communication of rates as per sections 3, 7, and 8, the Council shall update the calculations at least once per annum and shall provide the transporter with at least 15 days advance notice of any change in the transporter's rate.
10. No person shall transport milk at a rate or rates other than the rate or rates determined by Council. Prohibition
11. Order MC98-2, effective May 1, 1988 is hereby revoked. Revocation
12. This Order comes into force on the 16th. day of November, 2000. Commencement

APPENDIX "A"

Cost Elements:

Time allowed at startup, on farms, and at a dairy or dairy manufacturing plant.
Volume of milk pumped per minute.

POTATO PROCESSING CONTRACT ORDER-AMENDMENT

1. This order applies to dealings between potato growers and potato processors with respect to supply by growers of potatoes for processing by processors. The amendment adds the requirement for potato processors to supply the Prince Edward Island Potato Board with copies of all grade slips for potatoes received for processing from all growers in the province.
2. Board Order PB91-4 is hereby amended by deleting existing Section 3 and Section 4, and adding the following:

Form of contract

3. No grower in the province shall enter into a contract with a processor unless the form of contract for such processor has been approved annually by a meeting of growers consisting of those growers who held contracts with such processor in the previous crop year, which meeting shall be conducted by the Potato Processing Council on behalf of the Prince Edward Island Potato Board. All such contracts shall bear the following notation at the end of the contract.

Form of contract approved by the Prince Edward Island Potato Board.

Prohibition

4. No person shall sell potatoes for processing, and no person shall purchase potatoes for processing, unless such sale or purchase is made pursuant to, and on the terms and conditions contained in, the form of contract for such processor approved in the manner set forth in Section 3.

Grading Slips

- 5.1. All potato processors shall, within a period of thirty (30) days following the end of the month in which the potatoes were received and graded, provide to the Potato Board copies of all grade slips for potatoes received for processing from all growers in the province.
3. THIS ORDER comes into force on the 31st day of August, 2000.

OIL AND NATURAL GAS ACT
PERMIT, LEASE AND SURVEY SYSTEM REGULATIONS

(Approved by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated 14 November 2000.)

Pursuant to section 11 of the *Oil and Natural Gas Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. O-5, Council made the following regulations:

Information required	<p>(4) A call for bids shall include the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the location and description of the provincial lands for which bids are invited; (b) the total area for which bids are invited; (c) the location where the information package for bidders will be available; (d) the address where the Minister will receive bids; (e) the closing date and time for submission of bids; (f) the terms and conditions required to be met by a bidder; (g) the manner in which a bid is to be submitted; (h) the criteria to be applied for acceptance of bids; and (i) other information as the Minister considers appropriate.
Information on bid	<p>3. A bid for an oil and natural gas permit shall be on the prescribed form and include the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the type of work proposed by the bidder, including geological work, geophysical exploration, exploratory drilling and other activities specified in the call for bids or proposed by the bidder; (b) a description of the work plan and the time period in which it is to be carried out; (c) the monetary value of the work plan; and (d) any other information specified by the Minister in the call for bids.
Bid criteria	<p>4. (1) A bid shall not be accepted by the Minister unless the bid</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) satisfies the terms and conditions and acceptance criteria of the call for bids; and (b) is submitted in the prescribed form and in manner specified in the call for bids.
Late bids not considered	(2) No bid received after the stated closing time for submissions of bids shall be considered by the Minister in issuing a permit.
Late bids returned	(3) All bids received after the stated closing date and time for submission of bids shall remain sealed and shall be returned to the bidder.
Minister may decline bids	5. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the Minister may decline to accept any bids.
Subsequent call for bids	(2) The Minister may, at any time after the closing date of a call for bids for which no bids were received or for which all bids were rejected, request a call for bids for the same provincial lands on the basis of the

same or different terms and conditions as set out in the original call for bids.

- 6.** (1) Within 15 days of being notified that a bid has been accepted, a bidder shall post with the Minister, Security
- (a) performance security payable to the Minister in accordance with subsection (2) with a value of 25% of the total monetary value of the bid; and
 - (b) the required permit and rental fees.
- (2) Performance security shall be in the form of a performance bond from a company acceptable to the Minister, or such other substitute security as may be acceptable to the Minister, to ensure the proper performance of the permit by the permittee. Form of security
- 7.** (1) Where the successful bidder complies with section 6, the Minister shall issue an oil and gas permit Permit
- (a) on the terms and conditions of the call for bids and the bid, including the work plan described in the bid; and
 - (b) on such other terms and conditions as the Minister considers necessary.
- (2) Where the successful bidder fails to comply with section 6, the Minister If no security
- (a) shall declare that bid null and void; and
 - (b) may consider other bids submitted in response to the call for bids or disregard all bids and declare the lands vacant.
- (3) A permit shall only be issued in respect of contiguous areas. Contiguous areas
- 8.** The term of an onshore permit shall be 6 years and the term of an offshore permit shall be 9 years. Term of permit
- 9.** (1) A permittee shall complete the work described in the work plan which is described in the permit and shall comply with and fulfil all of the terms and conditions of the permit. Permittee to complete work, comply with permit
- (2) All work shall be completed in the year in which it is scheduled in the work plan set out in the permit. Work to be done in year scheduled
- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), where a permittee has, in any preceding year, completed and recorded an excess of any scheduled work required by the permit, the excess work may be carried forward to fulfil future work obligations of the permit. Carry for ward excess work
- (4) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), the Minister may vary the schedule for the implementation of a work plan as the Minister considers necessary. Minister may vary work schedule

Annual report	<p>10. A permittee shall submit to the Minister, on or before 10 days from the anniversary date,</p> <p>(a) evidence of expenditures made for work done and completion dates;</p> <p>(b) reports and maps showing the geological or geophysical examinations, aerial photographs, detailed logs, well history reports and all information obtained respecting the presence of water, coal, salt, gravel, sand and other potentially useful substances; and</p> <p>(c) such other information as the Minister may require,</p> <p>on the prescribed form.</p>

No well within 1 km, offshore	<p>14. (1) No person shall drill an exploratory well within 1 kilometre of the boundary of an offshore permit.</p>
Lease for additional well	<p>(2) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, an existing well in an offshore permit area may be capable of commercial production of oil or natural gas, the permittee shall not drill another well unless the permittee has applied for a lease and been issued a lease with respect to the area proposed for a well.</p>

OIL AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION LEASE

No gas, oil production without lease	<p>15. (1) Except as provided in section 94 of the Act, no person shall produce any oil or natural gas from an onshore well, without a lease of the oil and natural gas rights issued for the area in which the well is located, issued in accordance with the Act or these regulations.</p>
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- (2) A lease of oil and natural gas rights derived from an onshore permit area shall be for a term not exceeding 20 years, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Minister may consider necessary. 20 year term, onshore
- (3) A lease of oil and natural gas rights derived from an offshore permit area shall be for a term not exceeding 25 years, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Minister may consider necessary. 25 year term, offshore
- (4) A lessee shall comply with the terms and conditions of a lease. Compliance with lease
- (5) The allocation of a lessee's share of the oil and gas from the spacing area pursuant to clause 61(5)(c) of the Act shall be on a hectare basis. Allocation on hectare basis
- 16.** (1) A lessee may, at any time, surrender a lease upon giving 90 days written notice to the Minister. Surrender of lease
- (2) Notwithstanding any surrender or cancellation or expiration of any lease, the lessee remains liable for any act, matter or thing for which at the date of surrender or cancellation or expiration the lessee was liable under this Act, the regulations or under the terms of the surrendered or cancelled or expired document. Liability continues
- 17.** (1) In the event that a lessee fails to comply with subsections 1(2) or 15(4), or fails to pay the royalty as required by the Act and regulations, the Minister may cancel the lease upon first giving 90 days notice to the lessee stating the reasons for the intended cancellation. Cancellation of lease
- (2) If, within 90 days of the receipt of a notice under subsection (1), the lessee remedies the reason for the intended cancellation, the Minister may revoke the intended cancellation. Cancellation may be revoked
- 18.** Where a lease is cancelled or surrendered or has expired, the Minister may require the lessee to transfer to the province, or the province's nominee, all production and transportation facilities that may be required for continued production from the lease area, at fair market value, as agreed by the parties, or failing such agreement, by arbitration pursuant to section 19. Transfer production and transportation facilities
- 19.** (1) Where a permittee or lessee disputes a decision made pursuant to section 11 or 17, or there is a failure to reach an agreement on market value pursuant to section 18, the dispute shall be referred to arbitration by three arbitrators, one to be appointed by the Minister, one to be appointed by the permittee or lessee, and a chairperson to be appointed by the other two arbitrators. Arbitration
- (2) The *Arbitration Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap A-16, applies to any arbitration held under this section. *Arbitration Act* applies

SURVEY SYSTEM

Grid areas	20. (1) All areas shall be divided into grid areas.
Grid measurements	(2) Grid areas shall be bounded on the east and west sides by successive meridians of longitude of the series 61 degrees 00'00", 61 degrees 15'00", 61 degrees 30'00", 61 degrees 45'00", 62 degrees 00'00", which series may be extended by the Minister, as required.
<i>Idem</i>	(3) Grid areas shall be bounded on the north and south sides by straight lines joining the points of intersection of the east and west boundaries with successive parallels of latitude of the series 46 degrees 00'00", 46 degrees 10'00", 46 degrees 20'00", 46 degrees 30'00", 46 degrees 40'00", 46 degrees 50'00", 47 degrees 00'00", which series may be extended by the Minister, as required.
Northeast corner as reference	(4) A grid area shall be referred to by the latitude and longitude of its northeast corner.
Area of grid areas	(5) The area for each grid area set out in Schedule C is calculated on the basis of the Universal Transverse Mercator plane from the Clarke 1866 Ellipsoid.
Conversion, hectares to acres	(6) The relationship between hectares and acres shall be established by multiplying the area in hectares by 1/2.4710387.
Table 1	(7) The area for each grid area at a latitude as set out in Schedule C shall be the same at any longitude.
100 sections per grid area	21. (1) Every grid area shall be divided into 100 sections.
East/ west boundaries	(2) Sections shall be bounded on the east and west sides by meridians spaced at intervals of one-tenth of the interval between the east and west boundaries of the grid area.
North/south boundaries	(3) Sections shall be bounded on the north and south sides by straight line drawn parallel to the north and south boundaries of the grid areas and spaced at intervals of one-tenth of the interval between the north and south boundaries of the grid area and sections shall be numbered as illustrated in Diagram A of Schedule B.
Section areas	(4) The area for each section in a row across a grid area shall correspond to the area of the section in the first column of the grid areas as set out in Schedule C.
16 units per section	22. (1) Every section shall be divided into 16 units.
East/west boundaries	(2) Units shall be bounded on the east and west sides by meridians spaced at intervals of one quarter of the interval between the east and west boundaries of the section.

(3) Units shall be bounded on the north and south by straight lines drawn parallel to the north and south boundaries of the section and spaced at intervals of one-quarter of the interval between the north and south boundaries of the section and units shall be lettered as illustrated in Diagram B of Schedule B.

North/south boundaries

23. All latitudes and longitudes used in these regulations shall be determined according to the North American Datum of 1927.

North American Datum as standard

24. The survey, division and subdivision of any onshore area and the definition and description of those areas, permits and leases shall be done in conformity with the *Land Survey Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-2.1.

Land Survey Act applies

25. The survey, division and subdivision of any offshore area and the definition and description of those areas shall be consistent with the *Lands Surveys Act* (Canada).

Land Surveys Act (Canada) applies

26. Schedules A, B and C are prescribed.

Schedules

27. Every application under the Act or these regulations, or request for a service for which a fee is payable, shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

Fees

28. These regulations come into force on November 14, 2000.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 is the definition section.

SECTION 2 describes the process for a call for bids for an oil and natural gas permit.

SECTION 3 requires certain information to be provided by a bidder.

SECTION 4 requires bids to comply with the call for bids and requires that late bids be returned unopened and that late bids not be considered.

SECTION 5 allows the Minister to decline any bids made and to make subsequent calls for bids.

SECTION 6 provides for security to be given for the performance of the work required by the permit.

SECTION 7 provides for the issuance of a permit or allows the Minister to declare a bid void if section 6 is not complied with.

SECTION 8 provides the terms of onshore and offshore permits.

SECTION 9 provides the requirements to be followed by the permittee in undertaking the work described in the permit, and for excess work credits and enables the Minister to vary the work schedule.

SECTION 10 requires an annual report to the Minister by the permittee.

SECTION 11 allows the Minister to revoke or declare vacant or forfeit a permit, where there is failure to comply with specified conditions.

SECTION 12 requires a security to be returned after its expiry.

SECTION 13 sets limits for proximity of onshore wells and requires leasing for additional wells.

SECTION 14 sets limits for proximity of offshore wells and requires leasing for an additional well.

SECTION 15 prohibits oil or natural gas production without a lease.

SECTION 16 provides for surrender of a lease by the lessee and continues the liability of the lessee and surety.

SECTION 17 provides for cancellation of lease by the Minister.

SECTION 18 enables the transfer, at fair market value, of production and transportation facilities by the lessee to the Minister where a lease has been cancelled or surrendered.

SECTION 19 provides for arbitration of disputes related to revocation, cancellation, transfer of facilities to the Minister or determination of fair market value.

SECTIONS 20-22 provides the grid area system to be used.

SECTION 23 sets the North American Datum of 1927 as the standard to be used.

SECTION 24 requires adherence to the provincial *Land Survey Act* for onshore areas, permits and leases.

SECTION 25 requires adherence to the federal *Land Surveys Act* for onshore areas, permits and leases.

SECTION 26 prescribes the Schedules.

SECTION 27 requires that fees accompany applications.

**ROADS ACT
HIGHWAY ACCESS REGULATIONS
AMENDMENT**

(Approved by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated 14 November 2000.)

Pursuant to subsection 29(1) of the *Roads Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-15, Council made the following regulations:

1. Schedule D (Seasonal Highways) of the Roads Act Highway Access Regulations (EC580/95) is amended by the addition of the following:

(634) Road Index 21163: Road Index 21163 in the settlement of Cape Wolfe commencing at the intersection of Route 14 to the end of the road, a distance of 0.3 km.

4. These regulations come into force on November 25, 2000.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations include Road Index 21163 to Schedule D (Seasonal Highways), which was incorrectly omitted from the original regulation EC580/95.
