Drivers who have any type of medical condition, such as diabetes, heart disease, epilepsy, or vision problems which may affect their ability to safely operate a motor vehicle, are required by law to advise Alberta Infrastructure and Transportation of the condition.

Alberta Infrastructure and Transportation will conduct a medical review on an individual case basis for clients who do not meet the National Safety Code Standards for a specific licence classification.

## **Medical Appeal Process**

A driver who is denied any class of licence as a result of a medical condition may appeal the decision to the Medical Review Committee.

To initiate an appeal, the Committee will require a detailed medical report completed by a physician specializing in that field of concern. This report can be forwarded to Driver Fitness and Monitoring Branch along with any other information regarding the appeal.

NOTE: The Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan will only pay for medical examinations for motor vehicle operators who are 75 years of age or older.
