CHAPTER F-11

FIRE PREVENTION ACT

CODES AND STANDARDS ORDER

Pursuant to subsection 24(2) of the *Fire Prevention Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-11, and upon the recommendation of the Minister of Community and Cultural Affairs, Council made the following Order:

1. The following Codes and Standards are declared to be in force in the province and shall be enforced by the Fire Marshal under the *Fire Prevention Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-11: Codes and Standards

- (a) 2003 edition of the National Fire Protection Association's NFPA 1 Uniform Fire Code;
- (a.1) 2003 edition of the National Fire Protection Association's NFPA 101 Life Safety Code;
- (b) Canadian Standards Association B 139, Installation Code for Oil Burning Equipment;
- (c) Canadian Standards Association B 149.2, Installation Code for Propane Burning Appliances and Equipment;
- (d) Canadian Standards Association B 365, Installation Code for Solid Fuel Burning Appliances and Equipment. (EC16/85; 293/92; 663/99;622/04)

2. Any provision of an electrical or building construction safety Code that is referred to in any provision of the Uniform Fire Code or Life Safety Code referred to in clauses 1(a) and (a.1) Related electrical and building codes

- (a) is declared to be in force in the province; and
- (b) shall be enforced by the Fire Marshall under the *Fire Prevention Act*,

to the extent necessary to give effect to any provision of the Uniform Fire Code or Life Safety Code that refers to the provision of such an electrical or building construction safety Code. (EC16/85;622/04)
