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## CHAPTER V-3.1

# VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT

## REGULATIONS

Pursuant to section 37 of the *Victims of Crime Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. V-3.1 Council made the following regulations:

**1.** The amount of the surcharge imposed under subsection 9(1) of the Act Amount of in respect of a conviction under an Act or regulation under an Act is \$10. <sup>surcharge</sup> (EC566/89)

**2.** Money received by the appropriate court official in respect of a Priority conviction for an offence under an enactment shall be applied first in payment of the surcharge and thereafter in payment of the fine. (EC566/89)

**3.** For the purposes of subsection 15(2) of the Act, which relates to small small claims claims, the prescribed amount is \$1,000. (EC566/89; 411/99)

**4.** For the purposes of clause 16(1)(a) of the Act, which relates to entitlement to compensation, the sections of the *Criminal Code* (Canada) R.S.C. 1985, Chap. C-46 set out in column 1 of the Schedule relating to the offences described in column 2 thereof are the prescribed sections. (EC566/89)

**5.** For the purposes of subsection 25(1) of the Act, the maximum amount Maximum of compensation that may be awarded

(a) to all applicants in respect of the injury, or death of one victim is \$15,000;

(b) to all applicants in respect of one occurrence is \$30,000. (EC411/99)
