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## CHAPTER E-12

## **EXECUTIVE COUNCIL ACT**

**1.** There shall be an Executive Council of the province consisting of the Composition of Premier, who may be President of the Executive Council, and not less than seven or more than ten other persons appointed by the Lieutenant Governor on the advice of the Premier. 1980,c.1,s.1;1986,c.1,s.1.

**2.** Members of the Executive Council shall be appointed by the Appointment of Lieutenant Governor under the Great Seal of the province and shall hold Executive Council office during pleasure. 1980,c.1,s.2.

**3.** The Executive Council is responsible for the executive government of Functions of the province and the several departments thereof as set out in the *Public* Executive Council Departments Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. P-29. 1980,c.1,s.3.

**4.** Each member of the Executive Council shall be paid such Remuneration remuneration and benefits as are determined under section 46 of the *Legislative Assembly Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-7. 1994,c.34,s.6*{eff.}* June 2/94.

**5.** (1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council shall appoint a Clerk of the Clerk of Executive Executive Council who shall be of deputy minister rank and shall hold Council office during pleasure.

(2) The duties of the Clerk of the Executive Council are to provide Duties administrative services to, and preserve all documents and records of, the Executive Council.

(3) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint a Clerk Assistant <sub>Clerk Assistant</sub> of the Executive Council to perform the duties of the Clerk in his absence. 1980,c.1,s.5;1983,c.1,s.1.

**6.** There may be appointed pursuant to the *Civil Service Act* R.S.P.E.I. staff 1988, Cap. C-8 such staff as may be required for the proper discharge of the functions of the Executive Council. 1980,c.1,s.6.

**7.** (1) There shall continue to be a Great Seal of the province. Great Seal

(2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may vary or change the Great Variation Seal of the province.

(3) The Clerk of the Executive Council shall be the custodian of the <sub>Custody</sub> Great Seal of the province and shall cause it to be affixed to documents as required by law or as instructed by the President of the Executive Council. 1980,c.1,s.7.

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**8** (1) There shall be a committee of the Executive Council called the

Treasury Board Treasury Board which shall advise on budget preparation, financial analysis, government organization, operating policy and procedures, financial administration, collective bargaining, staff relations, human resource development, and classification. (2) The Board shall consist of the Provincial Treasurer and not more Composition than four other members of the Executive Council appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council. (2.1) Notwithstanding subsection (2), the Lieutenant Governor in Idem Council may appoint not more than two members of the Legislative Assembly who are not members of the Executive Council as members of the Board. (3) The Provincial Treasurer shall be the chairperson of the Board. Chairperson (4) The Deputy Provincial Treasurer shall be the secretary to the Secretary Board. Procedure (5) The Board may determine its own procedure. 1993,c.29,s.2; 2000,c.8,s.1. 9. (1) Without prejudice to section 8, the Executive Council may Other committees establish such other committees as it considers necessary for the discharge of its functions. (2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint not more than Members four members of the Legislative Assembly who are not members of the Executive Council as members of a committee established under subsection (1) and may designate one of those members as chairman. 9.1 A person appointed as a member of a committee pursuant to Remuneration subsection 8(2.1) or 9(2) may be paid such remuneration as may be determined by the Indemnities and Allowances Commission appointed under section 46 of the Legislative Assembly Act. 1983, c.1, s.1;1986, c.1, s.2;1993,c.29,s.2; 2000,c.8,s.2,s.3. **10.** The Lieutenant Governor in Council may authorize a Minister of the Agreements with other authorities Crown, for and on behalf of the government, or an agency of the government, to enter into an agreement with (a) the Government of Canada, or a minister or agency of the Government of Canada; (b) the government of another province of Canada, or a minister or agency of the government of another province of Canada; (c) a municipality, school board or other local authority; or (d) any person or group of persons,

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for the benefit or purposes of the residents of the province or any part thereof. 1980,c.1,s.11.
