CHAPTER H-5

HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT

MARITIME PROVINCES (LICENSING AND REGISTRATION) AGREEMENT REGULATIONS

Made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council under the Highway Traffic Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5

OPERATOR'S LICENSE

1. A resident of the Province of New Brunswick who becomes a resident Operator's license, of Prince Edward Island and who holds a valid operator's class of license residents of New for the Province of New Brunswick must within four months from the date of his coming to Prince Edward Island, surrender said operator's license to the Highway Safety Division of the Province of Prince Edward Island and receive a valid operator's class of license for the Province of Prince Edward Island without payment of fee. (EC602/72)

Brunswick coming to the province

2. A resident of the Province of Nova Scotia who becomes a resident of Operator's license, Prince Edward Island and who holds a valid operator's class of license residents of Nova for the Province of Nova Scotia must within four months from the date the province of his coming to Prince Edward Island, surrender said operator's license to the Highway Safety Division of the Province of Prince Edward Island and receive a valid operator's class of license for the Province of Prince Edward Island without payment of fee. A resident of the Province of New Brunswick who becomes a resident Registration, of the Province of Prince Edward Island and is gainfully employed, whose private passenger vehicle is legally registered in the Province of becomes resident in New Brunswick, must within ten days after he becomes gainfully the province employed surrender the registration permit and registration markers to the Highway Safety Division of the Province of Prince Edward Island and receive a valid registration permit and markers without payment of fee.
