CHAPTER H-5

HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT

SPECIAL TRIP PERMIT REGULATIONS

Pursuant to section 312 of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5, Council made the following regulations:

1. (1) A commercial motor vehicle owned by a non-resident is exempt Exemption from registration in Prince Edward Island to the same extent as a commercial motor vehicle owned by a resident of Prince Edward Island would be exempt from registration if it were operating in like circumstances in the province, state, or territory in which the non-resident is resident.

(2) The exemption under subsection (1) does not apply to a *Idem* commercial motor vehicle owned by a non-resident if the vehicle is used to pick up goods, wares, or merchandise from a point within the province for delivery to another point within the province. (EC902/82)

2. (1) A commercial motor vehicle owned by a non-resident which is not Permit exempt from registration under section 1 is exempt from registration if a Special Trip Permit is obtained and the vehicle is not used to pick up goods, wares, or merchandise from a point within the province for delivery to another point within the province.

(2) A Special Trip Permit shall be valid for one entrance into the *Idem* effective, province, and shall remain in force until the expiry of five days from the expiry dates effective date shown on the permit. (EC902/82)
