Road Test

You must wait at least 180 days from the date of issue of your Instruction Permit before taking a road test.

You are required to provide a vehicle in **good mechanical condition**, with valid registration, insurance and your Instruction Permit. Before the road test, your vehicle will be subject to an examination. It must meet the minimum safety standards required by law. Failure to meet the above requirements will result in the road test being deferred to another date.

If you are unable to attend your appointment, you must let the Access PEI centre know at least 24 hours in advance. Failure to cancel on time will result in the applicant having to pay for a new appointment.



Introducing the Novice Driver Course





Congratulations upon achieving your Instruction Permit for the Province of Prince Edward Island.

You are now beginning the most important stage of the driving experience – learning how to operate a motor vehicle properly and safely. The province requires individuals with Instruction Permits to attend a **Novice Driver Course** before taking their first road test.

The Novice Driver Course provides you with information you may not receive outside of formal driving. The course explains the Newly Licensed Driver Process; the Demerit Point System; the aspects of the Criminal Code related to Impaired Driving; Alcohol and Drug Education; and handling certain driving conditions.

The course lasts approximately five hours and is usually taught on two separate evenings, (or in one afterschool session – Elmsdale location only), and you must register in advance and pay a fee.

Be prepared to quote the ID Number from your Instruction Permit.

Information Regarding Your Instruction Permit

An **Instruction Permit** entitles you to operate a motor vehicle, motorcycle, or farm tractor, depending on the **restrictions pertaining** to the type of permit.

Motor Vehicle Instruction Permit

Your **Instruction Permit** entitles you to operate a motor vehicle on the highway under the



following conditions: You must be accompanied at all times by a licensed operator who has been the holder of a valid driver's license for *at least four years*, and is occupying the seat beside you, the driver. **Only** the immediate family of the licensed operator is permitted in the motor vehicle.

Farm Tractor Permit



The Farm Tractor Permit entitles you to operate a farm tractor only when you are under the supervision of a licensed operator who has been the holder of a valid driver's license for at least four years.

Motorcycle Instruction Permit



Your Motorcycle Instruction Permit entitles you to operate a motorcycle under the following conditions:
Daytime driving only, no passengers, no driving on the highway unless you are under the direct observation and supervision of a licensed motorcycle operator who has been the holder of a valid Motorcycle Driver's License for at least four years.
