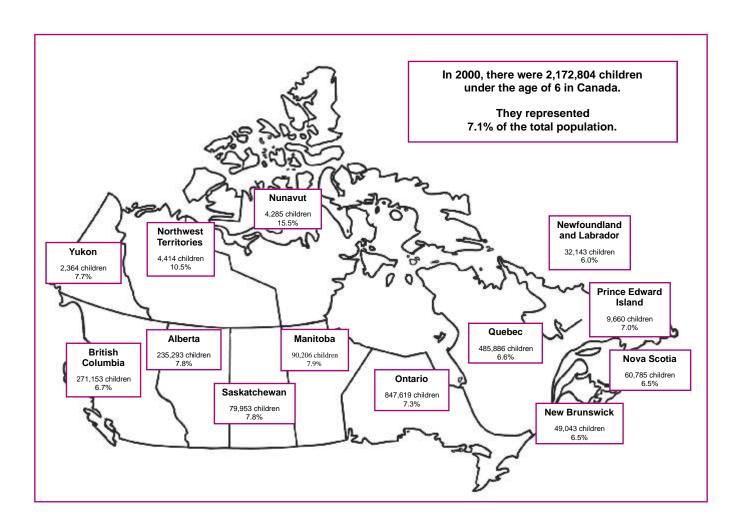
Where Do Our Children Live?
