## **Forum of Labour Market Ministers**

The Forum of Labour Market Ministers (FLMM) was established in 1983. The rationale for having a Labour Market Forum comes from the ongoing need to have interjurisdictional discussion and cooperation on labour market issues.

Ministers have adopted the following objectives as the mandate for the FLMM:

- 1. To promote interjurisdictional cooperation on labour market issues and to provide a forum to establish and meet common goals.
- 2. To promote a highly skilled workforce with portable qualifications through the development and expansion of interprovincial standards.
- 3. To facilitate Canada's adaptation to changes in economic structure and skill requirements.
- 4. To provide an interjurisdictional link to participatory structures such as labour force development boards.

The FLMM is co-chaired by the Federal Government and the Lead Province where the lead is assumed on an east-to-west rotation basis. Alberta is the current Lead Province for the FLMM. The Forum has established different Task Teams to address certain labour market issues. The <u>Labour Mobility Coordinating Group</u> was established by the FLMM to coordinate implementation of the Labour Mobility Chapter.
